People who play the lottery are always hoping for that big chance to win a super jackpot. Against all odds (literally!) they imagine winning millions. After all, someone has to win. It might as well be me. It's almost contradictory that lotteries have become part of state budgeting, when many Americans believe in the values of hard work and earning a living as opposed to the gratuitous windfall that a lottery would give someone. State income from lotteries exceeds that of tobacco excise taxes, but is less than the license fees states collect on motor vehicles. Everybody who wants something for nothing is involved. For the outlay of a miniscule amount of cash, a player dreams of an immense return. And the state gets a bonus to its income without having to tax its citizens more.

In today's Gospel, the people of Nazareth are acting a bit like lottery hopefuls, with high expectations for a significant payout with the investment of very little. They've heard about all the great things that Jesus did in Capernaum, and now they are expecting to cash in on the local boy made good. Surely he has got to work some astounding miracles here.

But Jesus is not a lottery ticket. And faith in him is not a something for nothing proposition in which all the benefits are reaped with very little investment. As we will learn as we read from Luke's Gospel in the weeks and months ahead, Jesus is headed on a journey to Jerusalem. His destiny lies in that city where he will suffer and die, and finally, through his resurrection, he will usher in the era of the Spirit that is poured out on the church. For us, following Jesus is a lifelong journey to our own Jerusalem in which we empty ourselves in the service of others. It is no lottery that we hope to win, but a share in Christ's journey through death to resurrection.

Dear Parishioners,

Monday, February 11, is the feast day of *Our Lady of Lourdes*, and since 1992 also designated by the Church as "World Day of the Sick." In his letter instituting February 11 as "World Day of the Sick," Pope John Paul II wrote that this is "a privileged time of prayer, of sharing, of offering one's sufferings for the good of the Church, and a call for all to recognize in the features of their suffering brothers and sisters the Holy Face of Christ, who, by suffering, dying and rising has brought about the salvation of mankind."

In his message for this year's observance, Pope Benedict XVI writes: "In the Gospel the Blessed Virgin Mary stands out as one who follows her suffering Son to the supreme sacrifice on Golgotha. She does not lose hope in God's victory over evil, pain and death, and she knows how to accept in one embrace of faith and love, the Son of God who was born in the stable of Bethlehem and died on the Cross. Her steadfast trust in the power of God was illuminated by Christ's resurrection, which offers hope to the suffering and renews the certainty of the Lord's closeness and consolation."

In recognition of this special time of prayer for the sick, I will offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday, February 9, 2013. In this way we can join our prayers to those of Catholics everywhere in praying that God send his healing presence to our sick parishioners and relatives and bless them with comfort and strength. Please try to bring your family members to this Mass especially if they are not able to attend Mass very often due to sickness and frailty.

Thursday, February 7, is Alumni Day at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. I usually try to attend each year to offer my support for the good work being done at the seminary and to visit friends and classmates. In addition, one of our seminarians, Matthew Graham, is president of the Student Government Association this year so I want to attend the annual meeting to hear his report on their activities. I plan to drive down the night before Alumni Day so Father Tony Russo will celebrate our 8:00 a.m. Mass on Thursday morning.

Ash Wednesday and the start of another Lenten Season is just around the corner. Our Masses on Ash Wednesday, February 13, will be at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:30 p.m. Please remember also that we change to a special schedule on Fridays during Lent, with Adoration beginning at 2:30 p.m., followed by Benediction at 5:40 p.m., Mass at 6:00 p.m., and finally Stations of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. You might start praying about what sort of activities you want to do for Lent so that it can be a season of growth and renewal.
