25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Certain selections in the Sunday funnies will occasionally show a harried mom racing around the house to complete the cleaning, laundry, dishes, and cooking. Hi and Lois is one such example. So is Hagar the Horrible. Helga, Hagar's wife, is usually portraved with an apron girding her waist, while she holds a cooking spoon or broom for sweeping. Helga is industrious, while Hagar, her husband, is off on adventures (from which he usually returns empty-handed) or hanging out with his crew. This caricature of married life resonates with so many people, not because it is an accurate portrayal, but rather because there is just enough verisimilitude to give the plot some credence. Helga is stuck waiting on Hagar hand and foot, while he is lord of the manor.

This Sunday-comics understanding of serving is not what Jesus is describing to his disciples in the Gospel today. As the Gospel story for today shows, there is a connection between the death of Jesus and being of service to others. A true servant is filled with devotion, as Jesus himself was. He gave everything, including his life, not because we deserve it, but because he loved us so completely.

And that's where the Sunday-comic caricature gets it wrong. Being a servant is not about oppression or domination, but about love. In marriage, that love is mutual. It is a two-way street, not one spouse only serving the other, but both spouses loving and caring completely for one another. In a couple that exhibits this kind of love, you'll sometimes hear one or the other of the spouses say, "I don't deserve her (or him)." And he or she would be absolutely right! None of us deserves the love that is expressed. But because we are devoted to each other our service to one another is the sign of our love.

Dear Parishioners,

Wednesday, September 26, marks the beginning of this year's **40 DAYS FOR LIFE** campaign, an ecumenical, faith-based effort sponsored locally by our diocesan Marriage and Family Life Office. Catholics and all people of faith are invited to join in prayer and fasting for an end to abortion. If so moved, you are also invited to join others in peaceful witness outside of the Delta Clinic abortion facility in Baton Rouge between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. daily during the campaign.

For Catholics, the first Sunday of October (October 7 this year) is also designated as Respect Life Sunday. It is a day to focus on the dignity of human life and to rededicate ourselves to prayer and advocacy for the protection of life from conception through natural death. While we have made progress in certain areas we nonetheless recognize that *Roe v. Wade* is still the law of the land, and human dignity is undermined in numerous other ways in our materialistic culture. Now is not the time to become complacent or discouraged, or to give up our prayer and advocacy on behalf of life.


Just after his election in 2005, Pope Benedict XVI was speaking to German pilgrims in Rome and said: "The ways of the Lord are not easy, but we were not created for an easy life, but for great things, for goodness." What a beautiful reminder for all of us, no matter our age, that we were created for greatness and goodness. Our response to evil and human suffering, especially in our local community, is often the context in which we live out this sacred call. These last few years it has been very inspiring to see so many of our Catholic youth accompanied by many of our seminarians and newly ordained priests, make the bus trip to Washington, DC to participate in the *March for Life* held every January.

The Diocese of Baton Rouge youth pilgrimage to the *March for Life* was first organized about five years ago through the initiative of Mr. Peter Fletcher, assistant principal at St. Michael the Archangel High School. More than 500 high school students now participate in the pilgrimage each year and many have commented on the powerful effect it has had in the growth of their faith. In many cases it has also provided an opportunity for the youth to reflect on their vocation and even to consider serving God as a priest, brother, or sister.

Speaking of youth, Julie Cilano and a group of parishioners have planned an afternoon and evening of fun and games for the youth of our parish on Sunday, September 30, 2012. the junior high gathering (5th—8th grades) is from 4:00—6:00 p.m., and the high school gathering (9th—12th grades) is from 6:30—8:30 p.m. Activities include an inflatable obstacle course, games, and pizza, so please encourage your kids to attend. Julie has also set up a St. John the Baptist Brusly Youth Ministry facebook page so you may wish to visit it and click "like" to keep up with future events.
