## September 30, 2012



### 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The bread machine that sits on the kitchen counter of many homes these days eliminates so much of the toil of producing daily bread. Like many of the other labor saving devices in our homes, it is meant to reduce the work while still giving us something that we want. Though we may have seen pictures, few of us have ever seen an actual millstone designed to pummel and fracture the grains of wheat into flour by the work of oxen that walk around and around to roll the stone over the grain in its circular basin. Fewer of us have even worked such a contraption, which was the labor saving device of its day. No longer did women have to pound, beat, and mortar the grain. The oxen did the work, and it was worth it even if you had to give the miller a portion of your harvest to ensure that he ground your grain.

When Jesus suggests that those who would cause others to sin should have a great millstone placed around their necks, his hearers knew immediately what he was talking about. Every village had its own millstone. It was right there out in the open for everyone to see.

We don't like to hear that sin needs a corrective. There is a natural inclination to hide the evil and to pretend that the sin does not exist. But sin needs to be brought out into the open to be cleansed. I'm not suggesting that everyone stand up on Sunday and tell everything that they've done wrong to the entire congregation. But when we own up to what we have done by exposing it to another person through confession it is like having that millstone right in front of us. We can see it; we can acknowledge it; we can admit that this is a part of who we are. And then we can let it go, no longer burdened with having it hang around our neck.

*At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me." - Mk 9:38-39*

The 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses are **canceled** on the day of the "Feast." So please make a note to attend one of these three Masses. The Fair Committee chaired by Scot and Pamela Rhodes will meet this Thursday evening, October 4 at 7:00 p.m. to review all of the preparations.

As in the past, we also have two "warm-up" events leading up to the "Feast on the Levee:" the huge **Garage Sale on Saturday, October 6, from 6:30 a.m.—12:00 noon** in the Parish Activity Center, and the **Cards, Etc. Party scheduled for Monday, October 22, from 9:00 a.m.—3:00 p.m.** in the Parish Activity Center. The *Garage Sale* is, of course, open to everyone, but you must pre-register to attend the *Card Party* and the deadline for registering is October 8. Your \$25.00 donation includes a spaghetti and meatballs lunch. Many thanks to Judy Cazes and Gale Thibodeaux respectively for chairing these two events.

In honor of Respect Life Month, Bishop Robert Muench will celebrate a **Respect Life Mass on Sunday, October 14, at 10:00 a.m.** at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge. All Catholics are invited to attend the Mass and the reception to follow in the parish hall of the Cathedral. We are fortunate to live so close to our Cathedral as to have the option of attending many of the special Masses and seasonal concerts. 
