Dear Parishioners,

A group of pastors and laity from a number of different churches in Iberville and West Baton Rouge Parishes held a gathering earlier this month to see if we could work together to address common issues of concern for our community. I attended the gathering along with several members of our congregation so that Catholics would be represented in what I hope will be a worthwhile effort. The group is tentatively calling itself the "Westside Sponsoring Committee."

There is always a bit of trepidation when joining such an effort because organizations can all too easily become politicized. However I see great value in Protestant and Catholic, black and white, Democrats, Republicans, and Independents all coming together to discuss shared interests. One of the biggest concerns early in our discussions has been the terrible traffic situation on the Westside. Other issues include housing, jobs, and race relations.

These issues are also concerns for the business community and industry, and so I was pleased that representatives from Axiall Corporation and Dow Chemical attended the first general assembly. The majority of attendees were African-American and Protestant, and so it will be very important for whites and Catholics to also participate if we are to build bridges of understanding in our community. I know we will not always agree on every issue or strategy, but I am hopeful that we can at least form relationships that are respectful of one another.

We plan to honor all of our high school seniors at the 11:00 Mass next Sunday, May 1, and then treat them and their parents to a catered lunch in our Parish Activity Center. We are extremely proud of their accomplishment and wish to assure them of our continued prayers as they plan for the next phase of their life's journey. We ask the graduates or one of their parents to please call the parish office (749-2189) if they can attend so that we can prepare the proper amount of food

We will likewise honor our Blessed Mother with a traditional May crowning ceremony on Sunday, May 8, at the conclusion of the 9:00 Mass. We will walk in procession to our Lourdes Grotto and then ask one of our second graders to place the crown on Mary. We will then offer prayers and hymns to our Blessed Mother as an expression of our love and devotion. This date was chosen to coincide with Mother's Day since Mary is the Mother of Jesus and the Mother of the Church. In honoring her we honor all of the mothers of our community on this special day.

Our landscaping improvements to the front of church are underway and should be completed soon. The goal was to increase the visibility of our sign by the road, lower the height of the first row of brick planters, and also try a different variety of plantings in the various areas. I hope it complements the beauty of our church

Our Catholic Daughters are holding their annual Jambalaya dinner fundraiser this Sunday, April 24, so please support them and their good work by purchasing a dinner or two.

5th Sunday of Easter

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." When people watch us, do they know that we are the disciples of Jesus?

As Christians, we are called to do more than love the Lord. We are called to be his witnesses in the world by loving others as well. In today's Gospel reading, he gave us a new commandment, "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Anyone, everyone, should be able to look at us and see this love in action. If we are not witnesses to this love, then we are falling short of our mission

So, how did Jesus love us? Selflessly. His love was never motivated by personal gain. On the contrary, he often suffered for us, and not just on the cross. He faced rejection and animosity for loving those who were considered "unlovable" in his culture. He lived a life of poverty and simplicity, never focused on amassing things for himself, but always willing to give of himself. This is the love we are called to imitate.

The task can feel daunting. We are not perfect people, and being witnesses to Christ-like love can strike us as a lofty challenge. Of course, it's easier to be selfless and generous with people who love us in return, or with those who stir our compassion. But to be consistent witnesses to loving one another in all circumstances--like Jesus does for us--that takes it to another level. Thankfully, however, Jesus doesn't expect us to do this on our own. He promises us his Spirit to live in us and love through us. Through our baptism, we have his Spirit dwelling in our hearts, along with the supernatural gifts of faith, hope, and love. May we make these gifts flourish.
