Dear Parishioners,

Father John Kavanaugh, S.J., (1941-2012) was a Jesuit priest, writer, and professor of philosophy at St. Louis University. He was a regular contributor to *America Magazine* and had a rare gift for applying the insights of our Catholic faith to the challenges of the modern world. Here is an excerpt from one of his reflections for Palm Sunday:

Our human circumstance, grand and grotesque, is at issue in the Passion. Our predicament is the healing of the wounds without the cover of cosmetics. Our problem is the solving of sin without endless stratagems of denial.

If only there were a way out. But unexpectedly, wondrously, the one who need not have been like us, yet chose to be, did not flee. He entered the Garden of Gethsemane to rectify the Garden of Eden. Not clinging to the robes of divinity, he took the towel to wash our feet. And we, with Peter, might murmur, "not just our feet, Lord, but our whole being, our pains and terrors, our aging and fading, our agonies and death."

Good Friday's wood, on which hung the Savior of the world, waits for our kiss. It bore the one who says to us, now and eternally, from the cross: "Yes, you needed this. And yes, you were worth it." We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

This week is holy to Catholics because of our collective memory and belief in our Savior's unconditional love for all humanity. Christ is our king who leads us from death to new life, and who nourishes our faith with the gift of his body and blood. You are invited and encouraged to participate in the beautiful Holy Week liturgies of the Catholic Church.

Please note that the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening will be at 6:00 p.m., an hour earlier than last year. It is a beautiful Mass but normally runs a little longer than a Sunday Mass so thus the earlier start time. (We will move it back to 7:00 p.m. next year if the time turns out to be too early for your family.) Mass is followed by adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for one hour.

On Good Friday, the Way of the Cross will be led by Deacon Sammy at 12:00 noon. I will be in the confessional during the Way of the Cross in case anyone missed the opportunity for confession. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion will begin at 3:00 p.m., and we will use a new cross we recently had made especially for the Good Friday veneration. Remember that Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil will begin after nightfall at 8:00 p.m. as required by the Church. The Vigil begins in the front of the church with the blessing of the Easter fire and the lighting of our new paschal candle. Our Masses on Easter Sunday will be at the regular times of 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 a.m. Have a blessed Holy Week!

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

"Then Peter remembered the word that Jesus had spoken: 'Before the cock crows you will deny me three times.' He went out and began to weep bitterly." Today's Gospel traces two tales of betrayal and remorse. At the Last Supper, Peter pledges his fidelity to Christ. He sincerely cannot imagine himself denying Jesus. Judas, on the other hand, is a liar who professes loyalty while knowing that he has already betrayed the Lord. Both men come to regret their actions. But their responses are different. Peter recognizes his failure, feels the bitterness of his actions, and weeps over them. Judas, however, does not weep. He tries to undo his action, and when he can't, he gives up hope.

Although Peter felt the weight of his sins, he did not give up. He got up after he fell and moved forward, remaining a loyal disciple, if an imperfect one. He learned from his mistake and, through his eventual martyrdom, fulfilled his promise to die for Christ. Judas of course could have reconciled with the Lord as well. Even at the moment of betraval, Jesus extended his mercy by calling Judas. "Friend." And he does the same for us. Even when we declare, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" one day and, "I do not know the man!" the next, Jesus still forgives us. Although we may waver when the Gospel challenges us to change, when our Christian witness means social stigma, or when our faith is tested by trial or temptation, nonetheless Jesus' offer of friendship never expires. During this Holy Week, let us pray for the grace to be good friends in return. May we be willing to accompany Christ on his path to Calvary, and remain steadfast with him all the way to the foot of the cross.
