Dear Parishioners,

The joy of Christ's resurrection is celebrated for fifty days, from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday. This season is a particularly good time to celebrate the sacraments, beginning with the reception of our new Catholics at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. then the baptism of infants on Easter Sunday morning, and continuing with Confirmation for our 11th graders this Thursday evening, and the celebration of First Eucharist with our 2nd graders next Sunday afternoon. Bishop Muench will also celebrate a special Mass of Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Baton Rouge for any adults who missed being confirmed when they were younger. Please watch the bulletin or contact our Christian Formation Office if you would like more information on being confirmed at Pentecost.

Pope Francis will canonize Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II next Sunday, April 27, the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday. A Mass of canonization is usually quite grand but Vatican watchers are speculating that this one might be more restrained in keeping with the emerging style of Pope Francis who favors simplicity. In any case, it will be a great occasion for our Catholic Church as we remember and honor two outstanding examples of spirit-filled leadership and holiness. I imagine both new saints will be popular choices for confirmation names as well as the naming of new Catholic Schools and Parishes.

The example of Pope Francis as well as our own experience of the forty days just ended, remind us that we need not be afraid of simplicity and humility. Doing without certain material comforts during Lent has once again shown us that we do not need a great deal of things in order to be happy and satisfied. We do however need experiences of resurrection for our faith to grow and develop, and these experiences are usually preceded by occasions of loss or surrender. There is no rising without dying. Something new cannot be born without something old being surrendered. We pray with St. Paul that both the dying and rising of Christ may be visible in our lives.

I am hoping to lead a 12 day pilgrimage to Italy and

France a year from now in April of 2015. The trip will start in Rome and finish in Paris, with overnight stays in Venice, Florence, and Nice, plus day excursions to many other towns. We will travel by bus through Italy and along the French Rivera, and then take the TGV fast train to Paris. Representatives from *Globus Tours* and *Vacations by Crown* will be here this Wednesday, April 23, at 10:30 a.m. and again at 6:30 p.m. to provide more information on the trip for those who are interested. I don't have a price yet but hopefully will have some numbers to present at the informational meeting. The trip is open to anyone to attend.

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." Mary of Magdala, seeing the stone rolled away from Christ's burial place, runs to tell the disciples what she thinks is bad news. The grave is empty. Jesus' body must have been stolen. Clearly, resurrection isn't on her radar. As it says at the end of the passage, "They did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Only later, when Mary saw Jesus again face-to-face, did she come to understand what had actually happened.

We, of course, know that the empty tomb really means good news! We know that the cross was not the end of the story, that Jesus conquered death, walked again amongst his followers, and ascended into heaven where he reigns even now. Unlike the first Christians, we have the testimony of history, the record of Scripture, and the benefit of tradition at our disposal. We have more reason to believe than Mary, Peter, or John did on first seeing the tomb! We need not waste any time "running" around like they did in search of the Savior. We know that Jesus is alive, and that sin and death have met their match.

"Where, O death, is your victory?" we can now proclaim with St. Paul. "Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:55). Jesus has won! He is triumphant! This is the joy of Easter, based in fact and bolstered by faith. And we are the heirs of this great joy. As we sing in the Easter psalm, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." On this most glorious of holy days, as we gather to feast with friends and family, let us be sure to recall the reason for our celebration: Christ is risen! Truly he is risen! Alleluia!
