Dear Parishioners,

It's been said that every pastor ought to have six weeks of vacation each year; because if he is a really good shepherd, he deserves it; and if he is not a very good shepherd, his congregation deserves it. The fourth Sunday of Easter has been traditionally known as "The Good Shepherd Sunday". In today's Gospel passage, Jesus tells us exactly who He is, because the most important thing we need to know is who is taking care of us, and whose voice we should listen to. In the Gospel Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me." So, if we are one of His sheep, we are already known to Him by our name. This is beautiful for us to know that we have a shepherd who knows us individually, and allows us to know Him intimately.

On September 11, 2001, the Pentagon was slammed by a highjacked airliner. People were trapped in the flaming building. A police officer ran inside and kept repeating in the darkness, "Follow my voice." Six people did so. Today, they owe their lives to that voice. Jesus also tells us, "My sheep hear My voice." As Christians, we are expected to follow the voice of the Lord and be led by His voice, in order to be saved. But, we know that in today's environment, it is very difficult for us to hear Jesus' voice and follow it. Each day, hundreds of different voices call for our attention. These voices offer solutions to many of our problems like, health, wealth, happiness, etc. They come to us with solutions for getting along in relationships, raising children, avoiding depression, becoming popular, getting ahead, etc. We should not be surprised if the quality of our lives is affected by the voices we regularly tune into, and choose to follow. Many countries and societies are brought to misery by the voice of a tyrant demanding that people suffer deprivation, or shed their blood for the fulfilment of that tyrant's political ambitions. Many families are stuck in constant conflict because their value systems are dictated by the voice they hear in their day-to-day lives. Our personal lives can be in turmoil if we decide to follow the wrong voice of a person at work or school.

I can assure you that you will be amazed to find out how much the quality of your life can be upgraded if you tune out other voices, and follow the voice of the Good Shepherd, who has your best interest at heart. That is why in the midst of all these confusing voices around us, the voice of the Good Shepherd invites us to listen to His voice. Remember, as Jesus promised us in today's Gospel, He indeed laid down His life for us. Jesus also says in today's Gospel, "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must also lead those and they will hear my voice and there will be one flock and one shepherd." Hence, when all of us hear our shepherd's voice, we become one flock under one shepherd. The voice of our good shepherd leads us to what is best for us, our family and our world. Therefore, we are all invited to listen to His voice and follow it.

Once a wealthy parishioner invited a priest and sacristan for dinner with other friends. Before the dinner, many guests displayed their talents by playing musical instruments and singing solos. Knowing that the priest was an accomplished singer, the guests cried out, "Father, now you must sing for us." The priest sang, "The Lord is my shepherd", with exquisite expression. The applause was loud and long. Finally, it was the turn of the poor sacristan. "I am illiterate," he protested, and I can only say the psalm Father taught me. With much insistence from others, the sacristan closed his eyes and bowed his head and began, "The Lord is my shepherd..." So sublime and spiritual was the sacristan's rendition that all the guests were moved to tears. Holding back his tears, the priest said, "I know the psalm, he knows the shepherd." The reading of this weekend not only calls us to know our Shepherd, but also to follow him.

Pray that God may bless each one of us that we know our shepherd and follow Him.


The Sanctuary Candle burns in memory of Merlyn Bourgeois.
