Dear Parishioners.

This is the last week for the *Light is On For You* program, so please make plans to come to confession in preparation for Easter if you have not already done so. The time is from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. this Wednesday, and Father Todd Lloyd will be here to assist us with confessions. I am also available from 5:00 – 5:30 p.m. this Friday evening, and from 3:30 – 4:15 p.m. on Saturday afternoon.

Our schedule for Holy Week is the same as last year with one exception. I moved the time for the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening up one hour to 6:00 p.m. It is a beautiful Mass but normally runs a little longer than a Sunday Mass so I wish to try the earlier start time. We can move it back to 7:00 p.m. next year if the time turns out to be too early for your family. Mass is followed by adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for about one hour.

The rest of the Triduum schedule is the same as in past years. On Good Friday the Way of the Cross will be led by Deacon Sammy at 12:00 noon, and then the Celebration of the Lord's Passion will begin at 3:00 p.m. Remember that Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. On Holy Saturday the Easter Vigil will begin after nightfall at 8:00 p.m. as required by the Church. The Vigil begins in the front of the church with the blessing of the Easter fire and the lighting of our new paschal candle. Our Masses on Easter Sunday will be at the regular times of 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 a.m.

Palm Sunday is next weekend so we will be cleaning and trimming palm branches this Thursday morning, April 10, at 8:30 a.m. under the rectory carport. Volunteer help is always appreciated, as are donations of sago palm branches if you have some in your yard. Many hands make a tedious job quick and easy, but you might want to bring a pair of gloves to protect against the thorns. (Thursday is also the third anniversary of the dedication of our restored church. If you remember, the church was rededicated on April 10, 2011.)

Congratulations to our new Columbian Squires Circle which had its investiture last Saturday. The Columbi-

an Squires are the youth branch of the Knights of Columbus, and their local units are called "Circles" rather than "Councils." Our founding members chose to name our circle after Father Lloyd Caballero, pastor of St. John the Baptist Parish from 1957 – 1973, who is buried in one of our cemetery mausoleums. The guys are just getting started and invite other young men to join them.

Our two-night Lenten Mission begins at 7:00 p.m. this Sunday evening, April 6, and ends with the 7:00 p.m. talk on Monday evening, April 7. Our presenter is Mr. Cooper Ray, former Director of Youth Ministry for the Diocese of Baton Rouge. The theme of the mission is "The Call" and Cooper's talks will explore the Gospel call to holiness, relationship, and mission. Please make plans to join us!

5th Sunday of Lent

"The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth." His heart had started to beat again, breaking the somber silence of the tomb. His lungs were breathing the air once more. The blood had begun to flow through his veins for the first time in four days. Lazarus rose from the grave, a living paradox: literally a dead man walking. Having done nothing by his own power, he once again knew life: a new life. This resurrection at the hands of Christ was an undeniable testimony to a power even greater than death.

For all our technological prowess and all our medical expertise, humanity has yet to pull off a stunt like this. Near death experiences we've heard plenty about. But four days gone? Even his sisters didn't want to approach their brother in a state like that, "Lord, by now there will be a stench." But Jesus wasn't concerned. Can you hear him yelling, "Lazarus, come out!" Can you see the deceased man emerging from the tomb? What a sight! What a miracle! What a God!

Nothing is beyond the reach of our God. Nothing can trump his power, not even death itself. This was confirmed for us on the first Easter Sunday when, unlike Lazarus, Jesus rose by his own power. And now, he wants to bless us with this same power! "I am the resurrection and the life," he told Martha. "Whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." Then, he asked her a question that applies to us as well: "Do you believe this?" As we continue our journey towards the great triumph of Easter, may we have the faith to answer with Martha, "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe."
