Dear Parishioners,

One of the most moving stories happened on October 6, 2006, when an armed man entered an Amish schoolhouse in Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania. He chased out the little boys and lined up the 10 little girls in front of the blackboard. He shot all of them and then killed himself. Five of the girls died. After the medics and police left, the families of the fallen came and carried their slain children home. They removed their bloody clothes and washed their bodies. They sat for a time and mourned their beloved children. After a while, they walked to the home of the man who had killed their children. They told his widow that they forgave her husband for what he had done, and they consoled her for the loss of her spouse. They buried their anger before they buried their children. Amish Christians teach us that forgiveness is central. They believe in a real sense, that God's forgiveness of themselves depends on their extending forgiveness to other people. That's what the mercy of God is all about. That mercy is why we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday.

On the First Sunday after Easter, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday, a feast based upon the private revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina. In extending this Feast to the entire Church, Pope John Paul II re-emphasized the resurrection context of Easter, citing St. Faustina's diary: "Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy." In describing this feast, Pope John Paul II says, "Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ, a gift which it offers to all humanity." When he declared the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, many took it as a papal decree to promote the devotions described in Faustina's Diary, such as venerating the Divine Mercy image and praying the Chaplet. This year our Church Parish also had the Divine Mercy Novena for nine consecutive Wednesdays. Being that this was the first time in our Church Parish, we had fairly good attendance on all Wednesdays. We can say that Divine Mercy is something like hope wrapped up in a loving God, who is ever ready to embrace us and forgive even our gravest sins.

In the first letter of Pope John Paul II we read, "God is love." In his encyclical letter, Rich in Mercy, Pope John Paul II wrote, "Mercy is love's second name." He also states that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. St. Faustina expresses this biblically formulated relationship between love and mercy when she says, "Love is the flower, mercy the fruit." Jesus takes the form of Divine Mercy whenever we reach out to him in our brokenness and misery. In our sufferings, guilt, sin and death, God extends His merciful and compassionate love to us. The message of Divine Mercy is that, "God loves us and wants us to approach Him in constant prayer, repenting for our sins, while asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world." He wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others, extending our love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

We must realize that God does not do anything in portions. He is infinite, and the amount of His Divine Mercy available to us is infinite. The only limiting factor will be us. The more we trust in Jesus, the more graces we will receive, and the more we will all come to share His joy. This is the message Jesus is giving us through today's devotion to His Divine Mercy. He tells us that this is a mercy which is unfathomable, and he wants us to spread it throughout the world through our own actions and love for others.

I wish you all a very Happy Feast of the Divine Mercy. God bless you all!




