### Dear Parishioners,

Here is an overview of our income and expenses for the 2012-2013 fiscal year which just ended on June 30:

On the income side, our Sunday collections surpassed our budget projections by \$25,000, so thank you very much for your faithfulness to Sunday Mass and your generous commitment to financial stewardship. The Building Fund collections were also outstanding and were applied to the repayment of our loan for the restoration of the church.

On the expense side, you can see that the largest categories by far are salaries and loan payments. We projected a very modest increase in salaries for this new 2013-2014 fiscal year, and decreased our budget for loan payments to \$153,450 since the five-year campaign pledge period ended on December 31, 2012. I ask that you please continue your support of the monthly Building Fund collection on a voluntary basis so that we can continue to service our debt. Our debt stands at \$1,275,000 and we can retire it in approximately 8.5 years as long as we continue to meet the minimum monthly payment.

The "Parish Share" category represents the portion of our income that we send to the Diocese to help pay for our diocesan offices and ministries. Each church parish contributes between 10% and 20% of their income with the poorest parishes assessed 10% and the richest parishes assessed 20%. St. John the Baptist was in the 15% category last year which translated to \$82,400 as shown above.

Our increased collections have pushed us into the 17% bracket for this new fiscal year, which means we have to somehow find the funds to contribute \$127,100 as our parish share over the next 12 months. It will not be easy, but as the last verse of today's Gospel reminds us, "much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." (Luke 12:48). We are asked to share more since we received more.

This Thursday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and a holyday of obligation. We will celebrate our regular 8:00 a.m. Mass Thursday morning and then a second Mass at 6:00 p.m. in honor of the feast day. If your schedule does not allow you to attend either of those, then please check with one of our neighboring parishes to see if there is a Mass that will fit your needs. Holydays sometimes involve sacrifice on our part but we know that such sacrifices also bring benefits to our lives.

Be assured of my prayers and best wishes to all of our students and teachers at the start of this new school year. Registration for religion classes is now open during the week and will also be offered after all of our Masses next weekend, August 17-18.
