Dear Parishioners,

It's all too easy for the average American to take public servants such as police officers and other first responders for granted. We enjoy their protection and take note of drug busts and other arrests as reported in the news, but we don't often stop to give thanks for the men and women who work long hours, endure stressful situations, and make untold sacrifices to safeguard our communities.

The recent killings of police in Dallas and Baton Rouge have served as a wakeup call to all of us who benefit from the dedicated service of our law enforcement professionals. Therefore we will honor all law enforcement personnel at a "Blue Mass" to be held here at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, September 25, 2016.

The date was chosen for its proximity to September 29, the Feast Day of St. Michael the Archangel, the patron saint of police. We will ask God to watch over these public servants, to protect them from all harm, and to grant them strength. We will also remember those who have died in the line of duty. The K.C.'s have graciously agreed to help sponsor the Mass and our cub scouts will provide the color guard. All are welcome to attend.

The RCIA process for people interested in joining the Catholic Church has an Open House this Wednesday, August 24, at 6:30 p.m. in the rectory, so please invite any interested parties to attend. We will provide an overview of the process and try to answer any questions before enjoying some light refreshments. Please pray for our inquirers and the RCIA team who will guide them on this journey of faith.

We had a beautiful turnout for the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick on the Saturday before last. Father David Allen from Holy Family Church in Port Allen was kind enough to join us so that no one had to wait very long to be anointed. I normally schedule the Anointing of the Sick twice each year in February and August, but it is also celebrated monthly at St. John Church in Plaquemine and at St. Joseph Cathedral in Baton Rouge. St. John celebrates it on the first Tuesday of the month after their 6:00 p.m. Mass, and the Cathedral celebrates it on the last Sunday of the month after their 12:00 noon Mass.

The Baton Rouge Diocese Charis Retreat Team will present a retreat for couples in their first few years of marriage next Saturday, August 27, from 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at St. George Activity Center. 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." For Jesus' original audience, this reference was meant for those Jews who presumed their salvation while judging others as being unworthy of entering the kingdom of God. Jesus was always quick to teach that believing in him was what mattered, not membership in a certain class or a particular religious circle. Therefore, some of the (last) Gentiles who professed faith in Jesus were ready to enter the kingdom before some of the (first) Jews who rejected the Messiah.

But we should not assume that this Gospel was only for those people in that time and place. Today, there is perhaps a different stratum of first and last. In our Christian era, we can be tempted to have the same presumptuous attitude that afflicted too many of the Jewish contemporaries of Christ. We can think that our salvation is assured just because we bear the title Christian. Likewise, we can fall prey to the idea that we are somehow better or more deserving of Christ's mercy than those who do not "belong" to our Church. This simply isn't true. God's mercy is available to everyone who humbly recognizes one's need for it. The minute we become complacent or overconfident, we close ourselves off to the gift of mercy God offers to the repentant sinner.

Jesus tells us today that we must "strive to enter through the narrow gate." This means that we must not take the easy road of presumption, assuming that we are in good shape because we look like most of the people around us. On the contrary, Jesus calls us to take the more challenging road of real repentance in order to "recline at table in the kingdom of God."
