#### Dear Parishioners,

This is a two-week bulletin due to the holiday schedule so you may wish to hold on to it. We have an abbreviated Mass schedule on this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent due to the addition of two Masses on Sunday evening. Our Masses for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent are at 7:30 & 10:00 a.m., and our Masses for Christmas Eve are at 4:00 & 6:00 p.m. later that same day. Masses on Christmas Day are at 8:00 & 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 25.

New Year's Day is the octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and normally a holy day of obligation. However, since New Year's Day falls on a Monday this year, the obligation for Catholics to attend Mass is dispensed. Nonetheless, we will still celebrate a Mass in honor of Mary, the Holy Mother of God at 9:00 a.m. on January 1, 2018.

I plan to take a few days of vacation between Christmas and New Year's so we will have Communion Services in place of the 8:00 a.m. Masses on Tuesday – Thursday, December 26-28. We will follow our normal schedule on Friday, December 29, for Mass and Benediction. We will also have a Communion Service on Tuesday, January 2, 2018.

Sign-up sheets are available in the rear of church for anyone wishing to participate in the monthly all-night adoration of the Blessed Sacrament sponsored by our Catholic Daughters. Adoration begins at 8:00 p.m. on the evening of Friday, January 5, and concludes with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, January 6, 2018. Why not start the new year right by spending an hour of silent prayer with our Savior in the familiar surroundings of our beloved church?





The little town of Bethlehem is no longer little, and the church built over the place of Jesus' birth is rather messy and noisy.
