Dear Parishioners,

We have reached the third week of Advent and the excitement is building around the parish. Our Parish Penance Service is this **Tuesday evening**, **December 16**, at 7:00 p.m., so please take a moment to examine your heart and join us if it has been a while since your last confession. Fathers David Allen, Todd Lloyd, and Brent Maher will be here to assist us. We may bring some of our junior high classes over as well to take advantage of this special opportunity to celebrate God's forgiveness.

This Wednesday is Pope Francis's birthday, so please say a prayer for the continued health and well-being of our Holy Father. He was born on December 17, 1936 in Buenos Aires, which makes him 78 years old this year. Most bishops submit their resignation at 75 but Cardinals usually work longer and are able to vote in a papal conclave until the age of 80. Popes have traditionally died in office, but Pope Benedict XVI set a new precedent by resigning for health reasons in February 2013 at the age of 85. We will have to see which path Pope Francis chooses to follow under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. But we pray that decision is still many years in the future.

Our own Bishop Robert Muench, also has a birthday this month and turns 72 on December 28. So in three years he will submit his letter of resignation to the Holy Father to see if Pope Francis wishes him to continue serving or transition to ministry as a retired bishop. In most cases, a retired bishop will continue to reside in his former diocese and assist his successor with Confirmations and other priestly and episcopal duties. Bishop Muench has now served as Bishop of our Diocese for 13 years and is our longest serving bishop, surpassing the length of office of Bishop Robert Tracy by six months.

On Thursday night of this week, December 18, we have our Pot Luck Dinner at the usual time of 6:30 p.m. in the Parish Activity Center. The theme for the meal is naturally Christmas, which provides plenty of latitude in choosing a dish to prepare for the evening. This is a difficult time of year to lose weight, but New Year's resolutions are lurking just around the corner. Our schedule of services for Christmas includes two Masses on Christmas Eve and two Masses on Christmas morning. The celebration begins on Christmas

Eve with a choir concert at 3:15 p.m. followed by our 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass. We then have a second Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m. which includes a dramatization of the Gospel by some of the children of our parish. Masses on Christmas Day are at 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.. (We do not have a midnight Mass.)

The annual appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious is this weekend, December 13 & 14. This is our chance to help provide for our consecrated religious who have given so much to the Church over the years. Since this is also the weekend for our monthly Building Fund collection, I ask that you place your contributions in envelopes marked "Religious Retirement" and then drop them in the first collection.

3rd Sunday of Advent

"There is one among you whom you do not recognize." With these words, John the Baptist was referring to his cousin, Jesus. Although Jesus had not yet begun his public ministry, John knew that Jesus was the Messiah. And it was John's mission to prepare other people to recognize that fact.

John and Jesus had first "met" in utero when Mary visited Elizabeth. Even from that early moment, John understood the significance of encountering Jesus. The Gospel of Luke tells us that the baby "leaped for joy" in Elizabeth's womb when the expectant Mary approached. Now that these two babies were grown men, John was still in the business of recognizing Jesus' significance. He describes his cousin as "the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." John knew that Jesus was something special. And he made it his goal to lead others to the same realization.

Of course, as Christians in the twenty-first century, we already know that Jesus is the Messiah. But John's words still raise an important question for us today: Do we recognize the real significance of Jesus? Do we take him for granted, or do we appreciate the gift of salvation that he offers us? Today's Gospel reading tells us that John came "to testify to the light." Do we let the light of Christ guide our way? Have we "made straight the way of the Lord" by putting Jesus first in our lives?

Today as we light the third candle on the Advent wreath, we would do well to reflect on the true light that came down from heaven. Let us pray, as this holy season continues, that our minds and hearts will be enlightened to grasp the true significance of the coming of Christ.
