Dear Parishioners,

Our *Advent/Christmas Concert* is today, Sunday, December 17, at 5:00 p.m. in the church. We receive many complements from visitors on the singing of our choir and this concert gives us a chance to enjoy their beautiful singing outside of Mass. Admission is free but you are invited to bring a canned good for our food bank. A Christmas Cookie reception will follow in the Parish Activity Center.

The time is now upon us if we want to celebrate Christ's birth with clean hearts and consciences. All of our neighboring parishes have celebrated their penance services. We are the last one on the schedule and our parish penance service begins at 6:30 p.m. this Tuesday, December 19. Fathers David Allen, Greg Daigle, and Ryan Hallford are scheduled to assist us so please put aside any worries or excuses and come to confession before Christmas.

We will be decorating the church for Christmas this Friday, December 22, beginning at 9:30 a.m. We need plenty of volunteers so the work can be completed smartly and efficiently. Service hours are available for students, and volunteers are needed to put the trees in the stands and the garland on the columns. John Toups is once again coordinating our decorations so please call or text him at 405-0826 if you have any questions.

Christmas falls on a Monday this year, and so everyone will need to attend Mass twice over a four day period – once for the 4th Sunday of Advent and once for Christmas. We will have an abbreviated Mass schedule next Sunday morning due to the addition of two Masses on Sunday evening. Our Masses for the 4th Sunday of Advent are at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, December 23, and at 7:30 & 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, December 24. Masses for Christmas are at 4:00 & 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 24, and at 8:00 & 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 25.

I plan to take a few days of vacation between Christmas and New Year's so we will have Communion Services in place of the 8:00 a.m. Masses on Tuesday – Thursday, December 26-28.

Since New Year's Day falls on a Monday this year,

the obligation for Catholics to attend Mass is dispensed. However, we will still celebrate a Mass in honor of Mary, the Holy Mother of God at 9:00 a.m. on January 1, 2018.

Our parish participated in the #iGiveCatholic campaign on "Giving Tuesday" and received a total of \$1,750 from 25 donors. Katie Roettger and our Mother's Day Out teachers and parents can now start researching playground equipment for the children. Many thanks to all of our donors for their generous gifts.

Third Sunday of Advent
