Dear Parishioners,

This is a two-week bulletin due to the Christmas and New Year's Day festivities. Once again, our schedule of services for Christmas includes two Masses on Christmas Eve and two Masses on Christmas morning. The celebration begins on Christmas Eve with a choir concert at 3:15 p.m. followed by our 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass. We then have a second Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m. which includes a dramatization of the Gospel by some of the children of our parish. Masses on Christmas Day are at 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.. (Note that we do not have a midnight Mass.)

New Year's Day is the octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and a holy day of obligation. We will have a 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Tuesday, December 31, and then a 9:00 a.m. Mass on Wednesday, January 1, in celebration of the holy day. Purple and gold attire is naturally acceptable for Mass on New Year's Day since L.S.U. plays Iowa in the Outback Bowl at 12:00 noon that same day.

I plan to visit my family in Metairie after our Masses on Christmas Day, and then take off for a short vacation with Father Paul Counce. Father Donald Blanchard will celebrate the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass here on December 28, and Father John Carville will celebrate the 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 a.m. Masses on December 29. Msgr. Gerald LeFebvre will celebrate the Masses on December 31 and January 1. Please join me in thanking them for celebrating the Masses for us in my absence. We will have Communion Services in place of the weekday Masses December 26 through January 3, 2014.

Sign-up sheets are available in the rear of church for anyone wishing to participate in the all-night adoration of the Blessed Sacrament being promoted by our Catholic Daughters and Knights of Columbus. This is hoped to be a monthly practice and begins at 8:00 p.m. on the evening of Friday, January 3, and concludes with Mass at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 4, 2014. Why not sign up to spend an hour of silent prayer with our Savior in the familiar surroundings of our beloved church? We would like at least two adorers during each hour of adoration. *Catholic Updates* on Eucharistic Adoration have also been placed on

the sign-up table and provide a nice refresher course on this important spiritual practice.

In case you were out of town last week, I mentioned in the bulletin that I am adjusting our wedding fees here at St. John the Baptist to bring them in line with those of other Catholic parishes in the area. Effective immediately, the fee for weddings at St. John the Baptist is set at \$300.00 for parishioners and \$500.00 for non-parishioners. The fee should be paid at the time that the church is reserved for the wedding. The one exception will be for registered parishioners of Holy Family Parish in Port Allen who may choose to be married here while their church is being renovated. They will be charged the "in-parish" rate as a courtesy.

Our Diocesan Respect Life Rally is set for Sunday, January 12, 2014, in the Main Auditorium of the Catholic Life Center. This year's keynote address will be delivered by Mr. Shawn Carney, the co-founder of 40 Days for Life and a well-respected inspirational speaker. The Pro-Life Oratory contest winner will also deliver his or her winning address, and Catholics of all ages are invited to attend. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

4th Sunday of Advent

"They shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us." No other religion makes such a radical claim. To be Christian is to believe that God is truly with us, in the most personal, intimate way imaginable; he is one of us! What a remarkable reality. Through the Incarnation, God became human and lived among us to love us, to guide us, to heal us, and to strengthen us.

Three days from now, we will celebrate this extraordinary gift that came to us on the first Christmas Day. All other Christmas gifts, no matter how exquisite or precious, pale in comparison to the gift of Jesus Christ. All the joys and festivities of the season, all the love and generosity that go into our beautiful holiday traditions, can be all the more meaningful when we keep this in mind.

We have been praying throughout this season of anticipation, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." The real magic of Christmas is that we get exactly what we prayed for! Jesus has come. God has answered our prayers and given us what we truly desire in the depths of our hearts: himself, Emmanuel, God with us.
