Dear Parishioners,

Each Christmas I enjoy reading over the following short meditation by Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, more commonly known as Padre Pio:

"One thing is necessary: to be near Jesus. You know well that at the birth of our Lord the shepherds heard the angelic and divine chants of the heavenly spirits. The Scriptures say so. But they do not say that his Virgin Mother and St. Joseph, who were nearer to the Child, heard the voices of the angels or saw those miracles of splendor. On the contrary, they heard the Child weeping and saw by the light of a poor lantern the eyes of the Divine Child all bathed in tears, in sighs and shivering with cold. Now I ask you: would you not have preferred to have been in the dark stable, filled with the cries of the little Child, rather than have been with the shepherds, besides yourself with joy over those sweet melodies from heaven and the beauties of this wonderful splendor?"

Christmas is the feast where we feel especially close to Jesus regardless of our personal circumstances or the events of the recent past. We are not afraid to approach Jesus who first entered our world as a small defenseless infant. We don't have to search for just the right words to say or the right attitude to adopt, but only to draw near and adore our loving Savior. He speaks to the deepest desires of our hearts, and continues to dwell within us for comfort and guidance. How blessed we are to annually celebrate so great a feast.

Father David Allen and I will take a few days of vacation this week to rest up after a busy Advent and Christmas schedule. Therefore we will have Communion Services in place of our 8:00 a.m. Masses this Tuesday – Friday, December 27-30. With the increased traffic on the Mississippi River Bridge and LA Highway 1, it is impossible to get retired priests to drive over for a weekday Mass. Thankfully, they are still willing to come for Saturday and Sunday Masses when needed.

Since New Year's Day falls on a Sunday this year, our Masses next weekend for the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God will follow the regular Saturday and Sunday schedule of 4:30, 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00.

Our 20th ranked LSU Tigers play 13th ranked Louisville in the Citrus Bowl at 10:00 a.m. this Saturday, December 31. It is rated by sports analysts as the fifth or sixth best bowl game of the season, and LSU will have to play very well in order to beat the Cardinals led by Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson. THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD

"She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Today we celebrate that the prophetic dream of St. Joseph was fulfilled! Jesus is born! A Savior has come to deliver us-Emmanuel, "God is with us." Christmas is a feast of fulfillment, a holiday of deep and enduring happiness not only because God became man and was born of a woman, but because along with his Incarnation, God brought us freedom. Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah who sets us free from the misery of our own sins. This is the ultimate gift of Christmas Day.
