Dear Parishioners,

The Advent Season is distinguished from Ordinary Time by virtue of its music, décor, readings, and prayers. The vestments are purple rather than green as in the preceding season, and the familiar notes of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" often accompany the entrance procession. And then there is the beautiful advent wreath with its four candles marking our progression through each of the four Sundays.

Here in our parish as in many other parishes we also celebrate Mass using pewter or silver chalices and patens instead of the more elegant gold vessels. We noticed last year that our pewter chalices had become rather misshapen from use so we recently purchased two new ones made of a more durable metal to use during Advent and Lent. They were not very expensive and we were able to cover the cost with our regular offertory income.

The annual appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious is next weekend, December 12 & 13. This is our chance to help provide for our consecrated religious who have given so much to the Church over the years. Since this is also the weekend for our monthly Building Fund collection, I ask that you place your contributions in envelopes marked "Religious Retirement" and then drop them in the first collection.

We can transform our lives and our community this Advent by each making a commitment to go to confession before Christmas. We already have a loving parish family but think of how much better we would be if everyone regularly sought the forgiveness of Christ in the sacrament of confession. Holy Family Church in Port Allen has its penance service this Thursday, December 10, at 6:30 p.m. We will have our penance service here at **St. John the Baptist** the following week on **Tuesday, December 15, at 7:00 p.m.** We also have our regular Saturday afternoon confessions from 3:30 – 4:15 p.m. every week.

This Tuesday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation. Our Masses on the feast day will be at 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The students in our Tuesday night religion classes will attend the 6:00 p.m. Mass that evening

instead of class. December 8 is also the beginning of the "Jubilee Year of Mercy" as announced by Pope Francis. A *Jubilee Year* or *Holy Year* is a special time for people of faith to grow in holiness through pilgrimage and other religious observances.

Remember to mark your calendars for our *Advent/ Christmas Concert* to be held on Thursday, December 17, at 7:00 p.m. in the church. Admission is free but you are invited to bring a canned good for our food bank. This is a small but simple way of observing the "Year of Mercy" by helping to feed the hungry. A Christmas Cookie reception will follow in the Parish Activity Center.




GIVE THE GIFT OF LIFE

Our Lady of Guadalupe

"Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Elizabeth uttered these words to Mary in recognition of her great faith. Indeed, what profound faith it must have taken for Mary to believe the words of the Angel Gabriel! The miracle that took place in Mary's body when the Christ was conceived in her would have been easy enough to believe once the pregnancy was starting to show. But before that concrete "evidence" was present, what a tremendous thing it was to be asked to accept. That Mary could conceive in her womb through the power of the Holy Spirit--outside of all human and scientific explanation--only a person of extraordinary faith could accept such a thing.

Perhaps this is why Mary chose to speak to St. Juan Diego. He too was a person of extraordinary faith. Like her, he was asked to accept something that defied human and scientific explanation when he listened to this lady from heaven up on the hill of Tepeyac. And like Mary, this simple peasant man chose to believe. He didn't dismiss his vision as a hallucination or the result of mental illness. Instead, he took Mary at her word and did what she asked him to do, even when other people thought he was delusional or dishonest.

In our day and age, just being Christian often takes an act of extraordinary faith. So many people have become skeptical of anything that can't be proven by science, that accepting Christ's divinity can be a challenge. When we are tempted to question or doubt the truths of faith, may we turn to the powerful intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego, models of faith.
