Msgr. Robert Berggreen celebrates the 50th anniversary of his priestly ordination at a special 2:30 p.m. Mass at St. Mary's in New Roads this Sunday, December 7. Msgr. Berggreen briefly served as pastor here in Brusly from April – December 1980, but is probably best known for the time he spent as pastor of Holy Family Parish in Port Allen for many years, before being transferred to St. Agnes in Baton Rouge, and then to his current assignment of St. Mary's in New Roads. He also served as vocation director during most of the time that I was in the seminary.

Among his brother priests, Msgr. Berggreen is best known for his kindness and his tardiness. Regarding his kindness, he is a priest who will listen attentively and compassionately to anyone in need. He is almost incapable of saying "no" to any request, which is an indication of his very big heart. However, don't expect him to arrive early for a gathering, and be prepared to start a little late. Please say a prayer for Msgr. Berggreen today in thanksgiving for 50 years of service to God and the Church.

The annual appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious is next weekend, December 13 & 14. Please remember that Monday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation. Our Masses on the feast day will be at 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The Blessed Virgin Mary is patroness of the United States of America under the title of the Immaculate Conception.



2nd Sunday of Advent

"One mightier than I is coming after me." In today's Gospel, John the Baptist speaks about what's to come. It's going to be different. It's going to be better. When he comes --the Messiah--something amazing is going to happen. "I have baptized you with water," John says, but "he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." With the coming of Christ, we move from water to Spirit-in other words, from the natural to the supernatural. Jesus takes our lives to a new level. But we have to be ready to join in on this spiritual journey. That's why John went around baptizing people for the repentance of their sins. He wanted to be sure their spirits were open to the Spirit. He wanted to help them be ready when the time came.

During Advent, we take a similar approach. We focus on what lies ahead: the coming of Christ. Of course he already came at the first Christmas when he was born of the Virgin Mary. Certainly, part of this season involves preparing for Christmas when we remember this original "advent" of the Lord. But another important element of these days is to make ourselves ready for the second coming of Christ. This is the moment for which we must always be ready.

But, we have an advantage that John's followers did not have. We already have the Spirit of the Lord in our hearts as baptized Christians. Now, the Lord himself is at work in our souls to prepare us for his return. The question is only how cooperative we are going to be in the process. How attentive will we be to the promptings of this Holy Spirit which are often as quiet as a whisper? Let's be sure, during the busy pre-holiday bustle, to set aside enough quiet time that we can properly "prepare the way of the Lord" by listening to his voice.
