We will be decorating our church for Christmas this Sunday, December 20, beginning at 1:00 p.m. We need plenty of volunteers so the work can be completed smartly and efficiently. Service hours are available for students, and volunteers are needed to light the trees and hang the garland on the columns. John Toups is once again coordinating our decorations so please call or text him at 405-0826 if you have any questions.

Our schedule of services for Christmas includes three Masses on Christmas Eve and two Masses on Christmas morning. We will celebrate *two* Masses at 4:00 p.m. Christmas Eve, one in the church with me, and one in the Activity Center with Father Jon Koehler, in order to accommodate as many as possible given the limited seating. We will then celebrate a third Vigil Mass at 6:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve. Our Masses on Christmas Day will be at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

Many people are wondering whether they should attend Mass on Christmas this year given the surge in COVID-19 cases. Even though Catholics remain dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass, that doesn't erase one's desire to celebrate our Savior's birth by gathering for Mass. Still, we know that the seating capacity of our church is very limited, so I encourage those who are undecided to celebrate Christmas at home. God will understand.

For those unable to attend Mass this year, you might light a candle and gather around the Christmas tree or crèche, and read aloud one of the Christmas Gospels, either Luke 2:1-14 or John 1:1-18. Then say a prayer for all of your loved ones and sing a couple of Christmas carols such as *Silent Night, O Little Town of Bethlehem, Away in a Manger, or What Child is This.* That way we will still be united spiritually even in the midst of our physical distancing.

The Parish Office will be closed on Thursday and Friday, December 24 and 25, for Christmas. I plan to take a few days of vacation the week after Christmas so we will have Communion Services in place of the weekday Masses on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week, December 29 and 30, 2020.

New Year's Day is the octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and normally a holy day of obligation. However, the obligation to attend Mass on holy days and Sundays remains dispensed for Catholics in the Diocese of Baton Rouge. We will have a 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Thursday, December 31, and then a 9:00 a.m. Mass on Friday, January 1, in celebration of the solemnity.


