Dear Parishioners,

Our second graders make their **First Reconciliation** this Wednesday, February 4, at 6:00 p.m. Please pray for them and their parents that this might be a special moment of grace for their families. Father Greg Daigle from St. John, Father David Allen from Holy Family, and Father Joey Angeles from Our Lady of Prompt Succor will be here to assist with our celebration of this beautiful sacrament.

Confession is a favorite sacrament of Pope Francis. In his weekday homily for January 23, our Holy Father said: "First of all, God always forgives us. He never tires of this. It's we who get tired of asking for forgiveness. But He does not tire of pardoning us. When Peter asked Jesus: "How many times must I forgive? Seven times?" — 'Not seven times: seventy times by seven." Namely, always. That's how God forgives us: always...There is no sin which He won't pardon."

In keeping with the feast of *Our Lady of Lourdes* and the 23rd *World Day of the Sick*, we will offer the other sacrament of healing, namely the **Anointing of the Sick** next **Saturday**, **February 7, 2015**, immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. Please encourage those who are struggling with health problems to attend this Mass and Anointing of the Sick so that we can support them in prayer as they receive the special grace of this sacrament. We will again use the Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos crucifix to implore the intercession of Blessed Seelos during our anointing service.

We finally received the last bill from the 2014 *Feast on the Levee* and the total net income of \$61,800 was very close to what we reported last November. After consultation with parish leaders, I decided to apply two thirds of the money to our loan and the remaining one third to our Building Fund savings. Our Sunday collections have also been very strong so I thank you for your generous and faithful support of the Church. We celebrate 180 years as a parish community on March 18, 2015, and I give thanks to God for watching over us and blessing us so richly.

The drawing for the Valentine's Day raffle sponsored by our parish pastoral council is just a week away. First prize will be a gift basket containing champagne, chocolate, and a gift card for dinner at Juban's Restaurant. Second and third prizes will be a smaller gift basket as well as a dozen roses and a bottle of wine. Tickets are \$5.00 and are available for purchase after our weekend Masses. The drawing is next Sunday, February 8, right after the 11:00 Mass.

Our monthly 12 hour period of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament begins at 8:00 p.m. this Friday, February 6, and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, February 7. All are invited to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration during the night or early morning. You are free to sit or kneel in silent prayer, or pray the rosary, or engage in spiritual reading and meditation while in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

As I mentioned last week, congratulations to Father David Allen and the parishioners of Holy Family Parish in Port Allen as they rededicate their newly renovated church this weekend at their 11:30 a.m. Mass. Lastly, enjoy the Super Bowl and all of the related festivities!

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." Jesus was doing something different. His teaching was new, fresh, surprising. The Jewish people were used to the teaching style of their scribes, the scholars who interpreted the Scriptures and taught the corresponding laws. The scribes were legalists by trade, who focused on what was required of the Jews based on the holy writings. For them, the law was dominant. But when Jesus showed up in the synagogue and began to teach, he was dominant. As the incarnate Son of God, he spoke with an authority that was greater even than the religious laws.

And just in case those who heard him doubted his legitimacy, Jesus proved his authority by more than words; he cast out evil spirits. When the people witnessed Jesus commanding "even the unclean spirits" and saw that these spirits obeyed him, they were "amazed" at this "new teaching with authority."

What our Jewish ancestors experienced is recorded for us to bolster our own faith. Although we were not there to see these events unfold, if we meditate on the reality of today's Gospel story we will also be astonished and amazed. Jesus is more than a teacher. He is more than a kind man with an attractive philosophy. Jesus has power over the spiritual world! His authority over us is real. And he exercises this authentic authority for our own good. He has the power to do away with evil and to set us free, both through his teachings--passed on to us in the Bible and in the Church--and through his action in our lives. We only need to follow his lead.
