Dear Parishioners,

Next Saturday, February 11, 2017, is the feast of *Our Lady of Lourdes* and the 25th *World Day of the Sick*. We will offer the **Anointing of the Sick** immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday. Please encourage those who are struggling with health problems to attend this Mass and Anointing of the Sick so that we can support them in prayer as they receive the special grace of this sacrament. We will again use the Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos crucifix to implore the intercession of Blessed Seelos during our anointing service.

Our Parish Pastoral Council is once again sponsoring a raffle for Valentine's Day. First prize will be a gift basket containing champagne, chocolate, and a gift card for dinner at a fine restaurant. Second and third prizes include a dozen roses and a bottle of wine. Tickets are \$5.00 and are available for purchase after all Masses. Several years ago Bishop Muench created a *Pastoral Planning Task Force* to undertake a study of our Diocese and propose ways to better serve our Catholic population. Our Catholic numbers have grown in certain areas and declined in others according to opportunities for employment and housing, but our ordination of priests has not kept up with the losses due to retirement or death.

Task Force members have now completed their study and therefore wish to present their findings to the Diocese at large. They are hosting presentations in each of the six deaneries or regions of our Diocese during this month of February, and the gathering for our Northwest Deanery will be on Thursday, February 9, at 6:45 p.m., here in our Parish Activity Center. The gathering is open to anyone who wishes to attend.

Preparations continue for our new Mother's Day Out program which opens in the fall of 2017. Mother's Day Out is part time child care that encourages learning and social skills in children. It will operate from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and is available for 1, 2, and 3 year olds. 5th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"You are the light of the world." Speaking to his followers, Jesus tells them of the influence they are meant to have. Like the seasoning that gives food its flavor, they are to be "the salt of the earth" and like a lamp on a lampstand that "gives light to all in the house." Clearly, their influence on the people around them is meant to be positive and substantial. But what is the source of this irreplaceable influence?

Elsewhere in the Gospels, Jesus declares that HE is "the light of the world" (cf. Jn 8:12). So when he tells his disciples that "your light must shine before others," he is speaking about the light that comes from following him, from believing in him, from living their lives for him and with him. The light of Christ brightens the world, showing us the truth and meaning of our existence. And to the extent that we have that light in our hearts, it naturally spreads out to impact those around us.

So, today we must ask ourselves whether or not we are shining the way we are meant to as Christians. Do we brighten up our families, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, and our parishes? Are people encouraged, inspired, edified, and supported by our presence? Do we bring the kind of flavor that enriches life with a taste of the authentic truth, beauty, and goodness that comes from God alone? Or have we become a bit bland, like salt that "loses its taste" or light that is hidden "under a bushel basket"? It's important to be on guard against any tendency to let our faith be reduced to a mere routine or ritual. Rather, when we nurture our faith to be a living force that defines us and our actions, it will be a source of joy and renewal not only for us, but for the whole world.
