Dear Parishioners,

The grace-filled season of Lent begins this Wednesday, February 10, so please take some time to decide on one or two activities of prayer or penance to deepen your faith and draw you closer to God. Our Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:00 p.m., and starting next week our Wednesday Mass will move to 6:00 p.m. followed by the Way of the Cross at 6:30 p.m. for the entire season of Lent (except for Holy Week). Even if your work or school schedule will not allow you to attend morning Mass on most days, you may be able to attend the Wednesday evening Mass each week as an extra opportunity to nourish your faith life.

In addition to the Eucharist, the Sacrament of Confession offers another opportunity to deepen our sense of God's mercy and love. Confession will be available in our church every Wednesday evening from 5:30 – 5:50 p.m. just prior to the 6:00 p.m. Mass, and then from 6:30 - 7:30 p.m. (during the Way of the Cross). Opportunities for confession will be limited during Holy Week so please try to go sometime during the first five weeks of Lent.

We are excited to offer a two-night Lenten Mission this year led by Father Mark Toups. The Mission will be held on Sunday, March 6, and Monday, March 7, beginning at 7:00 p.m. each night. Father Toups is a priest of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux where he serves as chancellor, spiritual director, and the author of "Oremus: A Catholic Guide to Prayer." He previously served as vocation director for his diocese at the same time that I served as vocation director for our diocese

In keeping with the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and the 24th World Day of the Sick, we will offer the Anointing of the Sick next Saturday, February 13, 2016, immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. Please encourage those who are struggling with health problems to attend this Mass and Anointing of the Sick so that we can support them in prayer as they receive the special grace of this sacrament. We will again use the Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos crucifix to implore the intercession of Blessed Seelos during our anointing service.

The drawing for the Valentine's Day raffle sponsored by our Parish Pastoral Council will take place next Sunday, February 14, right after the 11:00 Mass. First prize will be a gift basket containing champagne, chocolate, and a gift card for dinner at a fine restaurant. Second and third prizes include a dozen roses and a bottle of wine. Our parish office will be closed on Monday and Tuesday of this week for Mardi Gras, and our morning Mass is also canceled on Tuesday, Mardi Gras Day. Remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of both fast and abstinence.



5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him." Just when business was finally booming, Simon and Company closed up shop. The timing was strange, really. After a lifetime of fishing to make a living, these men had just hauled in so many fish that "their nets were tearing" and "the boats were in danger of sinking." Just imagine the profit on the other side of this night's work! Just imagine how their reputation would have grown. How easy it would have been to go out and buy a new fleet of boats and to upgrade their stash of nets. Most likely for the first time, wealth was within reach.

And yet, just then, Simon, James, and John left their boats on the shore and followed Jesus in the task of "catching men." This is astonishing. Not only did they give up their sudden monetary success, they gave up EVERYTHING. In a moment's time, these men radically altered their life, their plans, their future, and their fortune. And civilization has never been the same since.

Thanks in large part to the courage of these first apostles, and of their successors the bishops, and of all the faithful men and women religious throughout history who have "left everything and followed him," our church has continued to flourish and our culture has been greatly enhanced. Those of us who are members of the laity are likewise called to follow Christ, of course. The tremendous sacrifices that priests and religious sisters make should inspire us, and remind us that serving Christ-at any cost-is worth it. Their lives stand as a powerful witness indeed. Today, let us pause to thank God for these men and women and to ask his blessing on them all.
