Dear Parishioners,

A couple of weeks ago I mentioned that Kenny and Ann Cazes have completed the training to assist anyone seeking an annulment of a prior marriage. I forgot to mention that Deacon Sammy Collura is also trained and available to help with this process. So don't hesitate to call any of us if you would like more information or wish to get started on your annulment. The hardest part is the first step, but after completing the writing of your history the case sort of runs on its own.

Most people find the process of reflection and writing to be therapeutic and helpful to the healing process. The questions contained in the outline are necessarily very personal because of the characteristics which define a sacred union. A declaration of nullity does not mean that there wasn't some good in the marriage or that the marriage never existed. It simply means that something essential was missing according to our Catholic and biblical understanding of the sacrament of marriage.

Every marriage is presumed to be sacramental until the opposite is proven. To this end the marriage tribunal examines the testimony to determine whether all of the essential elements were present, such as freedom of choice, sufficient maturity, emotional capability, openness to children, and commitment to fidelity and the welfare of one's spouse. The legitimacy of children is unaffected because we do not pretend the marriage never occurred but only whether it contained all of the elements essential to sacramental marriage.

At first glance, many people including some Catholics feel it would be much easier if the Catholic Church simply recognized and permitted divorce as other churches have done. Some feel the whole concept of annulments is simply a matter of semantics. I agree that the process can appear convoluted at times, but I also appreciate that the Church is trying its best to remain faithful to what Jesus said and taught in the scriptures, namely that a man and woman joined by God are no longer two but one flesh. Christian marriage is not merely a human construction but a divine institution leading to greater union with Christ.

St. Paul and the other apostles and leaders in the early Church struggled with some of these same issues. In chapter seven of his First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul has to make a decision in the case of a marriage between two gentiles when only one of them is Christian and the non-believing spouse wishes to separate. St. Paul writes that he would like for them to stay together but if they cannot live together in peace then let them separate. He is clear though that this is his own judgment and not the Lord's teaching. We trust that the Holy Spirit continues to guide our canonical process as we seek to help those recover from difficult situations

Our next Parish Pot Luck supper is this Thursday evening, February 20, at 6:30 p.m. in the parish activity center. The theme this month is "breakfast foods" and all parishioners and friends are invited to attend. We will also have a special guest speaker at the dinner, Mrs. Tessie Blanchard DiFulco, who serves as the Advocate for Persons with Disabilities at Catholic Charities of Baton Rouge. 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." In today's Gospel, Jesus takes the Ten Commandments to a deeper level. Instead of focusing merely on external actions, like murder or adultery, Jesus wants us to examine what is in our hearts, like anger or lust. These internal dispositions are the root cause of the outward sins. Jesus is teaching us to take responsibility for our attitudes as well as our actions.

Some may say that we cannot control our internal thoughts and feelings, or that it's unrealistic to expect us to eliminate anger and lust from our inner selves. But, as Saint Thérèse of Lisieux put it, Christ would not command the impossible. So it must be possible to purify our hearts and control our thoughts. But we don't have to do this on our own power. Jesus expects great things of us, but he doesn't expect us to do them alone! Through the presence of his Spirit in our hearts, we have divine assistance to accomplish this task.

When we pray to God for the gift of the Holy Spirit, he responds by filling our hearts with the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit-wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, fear of the Lord, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. When these wonderful things are present within us, the bad things have nowhere to settle. Thus we can be transformed into people who don't just live the commandments, but who love them as well.
