Dear Parishioners,

Our second graders celebrate their First Reconciliation this Wednesday, January 18, at 6:00 p.m. Please pray for them and their parents that this might be a special moment of grace for their families. Fathers Joey Angeles, Todd Lloyd, and Amrit Raj will be here to assist with our celebration of this beautiful sacrament.

Our Catholic faith teaches that it is next to impossible to make any real progress in the practice of faith until we discover that our sins can be forgiven. So we try to impart this lesson at the relatively young age of seven, with the understanding that a deeper awareness of this mystery will only come with the passage of time and the benefit of experience. So do not give up if you are still wrestling with the practice of this sacrament in your own life. Its value only gradually becomes apparent after many years of trying to reconcile the presence of both grace and sin in our lives as baptized children of God.

The "Louisiana Life March" will be held next Saturday, January 21, beginning at 10:00 a.m. at Galvez Plaza behind the Old State Capitol. Participants will march to the new State Capitol where there will be speeches and prayers for the sanctity of life. The program usually ends around 12:00 noon. Sunday, January 22, is the 44th anniversary of the *Roe vs. Wade* Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion. Since January 22 falls on a Sunday this year, the observance of the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children" for all dioceses in the United States is transferred to Monday, January 23.

The national "March for Life" will take place in Washington, DC on Friday, January 27, this year. The "March" is a week later than usual due to the Presidential Inauguration on the preceding Friday, January 20. We pray for all of the participants in the March, especially the young people from our parish and diocese, who give powerful witness to the beauty of life and the dignity of each person. We also pray for our new president and all of our elected officials as they begin a new year of governing our country.

Several men from our Diocese have organized a Catholic Men's Conference to be held on Saturday,

February 11, 2017, at Sacred Heart Church in Baton Rouge, beginning at 7:30 a.m. and ending with the 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass. Speakers include Dr. Brant Pitre from Notre Dame Seminary, Fr. Michael Champagne of the Community of Jesus Crucified, Sr. John Thomas Armour of the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia, and Mr. Mark Hartfiel, national program director for the *That Man is You* program. 

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God." John the Baptist had an important message to impart. He was called by God to prepare the people of Israel to recognize Jesus' true identity. In a sense, he helped establish credibility for Christ by confirming that he was in fact the Messiah. Jesus didn't just have to claim it on his own; John also "testified" to the fact. We, of course, also benefit from the witness of John the Baptist recorded for us in the Gospels. And we have additional witnesses from the rest of the people throughout the Gospels who knew and recognized Jesus as the Son of God. But we also have the benefit of two thousand years of Church history! We have countless testimonies of saints and believers throughout the centuries who have known Jesus in their own lives and acted accordingly.

This raises two questions. First, are we willing to believe these testimonies from those who have gone before us? Consider how much credence we give to the experiences and the stories of our forefathers and foremothers in the faith--whether they are blood relatives or members of the larger communion of saints. Sometimes these personal accounts of coming to know the Lord are much more powerful than any "proof" or intellectual proposal about Christianity. They do require a degree of faith and trust, but they none-theless provide us with real evidence about the impact of being close to Christ.

Secondly, let us consider whether or not we are willing to give testimony to who Christ is to us? It's one thing to believe in Jesus; it's another thing to share that faith with others. But like John the Baptist, we are called to share the truth so that others may come to believe.
