Dear Parishioners,

I am scheduled to be one of the presenters on an Engaged Encounter next weekend, January 23-25, so Father Matthew Bonk, CSsR, will celebrate all of our Masses in my absence. Engaged Encounter is an expansion and improvement over the old Pre-Cana weekends that Catholic couples attended in years past. In addition to meetings with their priest, today's couples benefit from listening to talks given by married couples and then writing in their notebooks prior to one-on-one discussions with their fiancé.

In addition to attending the weekend, engaged couples from our parish also complete an online survey entitled *Prepare/Enrich* and then meet with a sponsor couple from our parish to discuss the various topics and results. We now have five married couples trained as sponsor couples to assist engaged couples with their preparations for the sacrament of marriage. The engaged couples have enjoyed meeting with the sponsor couples and both couples benefit from the time spent together.

Speaking of romance and marriage, our parish pastoral council is once again sponsoring a Valentine's Day raffle. First prize will be a gift basket containing champagne, chocolate, and a gift card for dinner at a fine restaurant. Second and third prizes will be a smaller gift basket as well as a dozen roses and a bottle of wine. Tickets are \$5.00 and go on sale this weekend after all Masses. The drawing will be held on Sunday, February 8, right after the 11:00 Mass.

The Mass readings for this weekend and next describe the call of Samuel and Jonah in the Old Testament, as well as that of the first followers of Jesus in the New Testament. They encourage us to reflect on our own call to follow Christ and serve him faithfully both at home and in the world. They also remind us to pray and work for more vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated religious life. As the Bible relates, God often uses human instruments to deliver his message and invitation. We have to give voice to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and encourage our young people to be open to a religious call.

This Thursday, January 22, is designated as a "Day of

Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children" for all dioceses in the United States. It is the 42nd anniversary of the *Roe vs. Wade* Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion. The national "March for Life" will take place in Washington, DC on Thursday, and all Catholics are encouraged to spend some time in prayer and fasting for the protection of unborn children. The "Louisiana Life March" will be held next Saturday, January 24, beginning at 10:00 a.m. at the Greek Theater on the LSU campus.

Finally, please join me in congratulating all of our 11th graders who celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation last Thursday evening. They are now fully initiated members of the Catholic Church and ready to contribute to the building of God's kingdom. I pray that God will continue to bless and guide their journey of faith as they finish their high school studies. I also offer thanks to their sponsors and our Confirmation team members for their great work.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"What are you looking for?" When Jesus asked the two disciples this question, they didn't give an answer. Instead, they asked another question: "Where are you staying?" Obviously these men were interested in learning more about Jesus. They wanted to accompany him and be in his presence. They decided to spend the whole day with him. But they were not quite ready to reveal what they were really looking for.

Remember that at the time, these men were disciples of John the Baptist. They had heard John announce the coming of the Christ, but they didn't know yet who he was. John's followers were certainly looking for something: the Messiah. Most likely, these men were interested in seeing for themselves whether or not this Jesus was the one they had been waiting for.

Apparently, he was. Andrew was convinced by that daylong encounter with Jesus. In the verse that follows to-day's Gospel, we learn that "He first found his own brother Simon and told him, 'We have found the Messiah'" (Jn 1:41). What a joy this must have been for Andrew! He found what he was looking for. Indeed, the joy was so great that he couldn't wait to share the good news.

When we, like Andrew, take time to "spend the day" with Jesus, getting to know who he really is through our daily prayer, then the happiness we experience will naturally overflow to others. The process may begin with questions about who Jesus is; that's only natural. But once we find what we are looking for, we can do what Andrew did by sharing the joy of the discovery with our own brothers, sisters, neighbors, and friends right here at home.
