### **January 20, 2013**



#### 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Occasionally we hear someone speak about experiencing a miracle. Usually it involves rescue from some accident or health crisis. "It was a miracle that car didn't hit me, the way they were driving" or "It was a miracle they were able to save her leg, the way that it was smashed." We even talk about "miracle" drugs, a reference to the amazing properties of life-saving antibiotics, antivirals, and certain other compounds. Miracles have a character of the unexplained to them. While scientists can describe in great detail the action of "miracle" drugs, to the rest of us they seem just amazing. Doctors can illuminate the process by which someone is healed through surgery and therapy, but again, it seems almost unbelievable when we see the results. Engineers can detail why a collision never happened, but to those who escape harm, it seems like a miracle indeed!

The miracle at the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee is the third aspect of what comprises the manifestation of Christ known as the Epiphany mystery. (The appearance of the Magi and the baptism at the Jordan are the other two.) In his Gospel, John describes the action by Jesus at Cana as a "sign" that reveals his glory. It is the revelation of his glory that causes the disciples to believe in him. Jesus is made manifest, and so people come to believe. It is what happened to the Magi; it is what happened to the crowds gathered at the Jordan; it is what happens to the disciples who are with him at the wedding feast.

The wonder of God's glory is not reserved to spectacular miracles that take place only at rare intervals. It is a wonder that a drug can cure someone, or that a surgeon can work so skillfully, or that for whatever reason, accidents are avoided. Seeing the manifestation of God's action each day is the sign of one who believes that the Word is made flesh and dwells among us.

Dear Parishioners,

Please join me in offering prayerful support to our forty-three second graders who will celebrate their First Reconciliation this Tuesday evening, January 22. I wish to thank their parents and religion teachers for preparing the children for this important moment, and for the many ways they reinforce the practice of forgiveness in their lives.

Our religion teaches that it is next to impossible to make any real progress in the practice of faith until we discover that our sins can be forgiven. So we try to impart this lesson at the relatively young age of seven, with the understanding that a deeper awareness of this mystery will only come with the passage of time and the benefit of experience. So do not give up if you are still wrestling with the practice of this sacrament in your own life. Its value only gradually becomes apparent after many years of trying to reconcile the presence of both grace and sin in our lives as baptized children of God

Consider this quote from Pope John Paul I, who was pope for only 33 days before his sudden death on September 28, 1978: "What a mistake those who do not hope make! Judas made a huge blunder the day in which he sold Christ for 30 denarii, but he made an even bigger one when he thought that his sin was too great to be forgiven. No sin is too big: any wretchedness, however great, can always be enclosed in infinite mercy." Our sins do become larger as we grow from childhood to adulthood, but they can never outgrow God's mercy.

I will be away from the parish next weekend, January 26-27, assisting with an Engaged Encounter for couples preparing for the sacrament of marriage. No one priest was available to say all four of our Masses, so Father Tony Russo will cover the Saturday vigil Mass, Father John Carville will celebrate the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses, and a still to be determined third priest will celebrate the 7:30 Mass. The Engaged Encounter community is responsible for finding a replacement for me when I am helping with one of their weekends.

Engaged Encounter is an expanded and improved version of the old Pre-Cana workshops. Two married

couples and a priest give presentations on a variety of topics related to marriage. After each talk, the engaged couples spend a few minutes writing in their notebooks, and then go off and find a quiet spot to swap notebooks and read what each other wrote. The purpose of the weekend is to help engaged couples develop their communication and understanding so as to avoid some of the pitfalls common to married life.

We also desire that they gain a better appreciation of the sacrament of marriage, and to realize the important role that God plays in healthy marriages. The best way to gain an appreciation for the spiritual underpinning of marriage is to see it witnessed by other married couples. So less teaching and more witnessing is one of the goals of good marriage preparation, which is why I want to involve some of our married couples in the preparation process. We currently have about 15 weddings scheduled for 2013, so please remember all of our engaged couples in your prayers as they prepare for their sacrament.
