Dear Parishioners,

Tuesday, February 11, is the feast of *Our Lady of Lourdes* and the 22nd *World Day of the Sick*. In instituting the World Day of the Sick, Pope John Paul II characterized it as "a special time of prayers and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of humankind."

Pope Francis recently released his 2014 message for the World Day of the Sick and said, "When we draw near with tender love to those in need of care, we bring hope and God's smile to the contradictions of the world. When generous devotion to others becomes the hallmark of our actions, we give way to the Heart of Christ and bask in its warmth, and thus contribute to the coming of God's Kingdom."

In union with Pope Francis and strengthened by the prayers of Catholics throughout the world, we will offer the **Sacrament** of the **Anointing of the Sick** on **Saturday, February 8, 2014**, immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. Please encourage those who are struggling with health problems to attend this Mass and Anointing of the Sick so that we can support them in prayer as they receive the special grace of this sacrament.

While I was vacationing in New Orleans earlier this year, I visited the Shrine of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos and picked up some prayer cards and a small crucifix which was placed against a relic of Blessed Seelos. We will use the holy cards and crucifix to implore the intercession of Blessed Seelos during our anointing service. Blessed Seelos died of yellow fever in 1867 in New Orleans while caring for the sick and dying.

As I mentioned last week, I am helping with an Engaged Encounter this weekend, January 24-26, so please welcome Father Tony Russo as he celebrates our Masses in my absence. Please remember also the Valentine's Day raffle being sponsored by our parish pastoral council. First prize will be a gift basket containing champagne, chocolate, and a gift card for dinner at a restaurant. Second and third prizes are a dozen

roses and a bottle of wine. And don't forget to pray for the success of the "Come, Follow Me" vocation retreat being sponsored by our diocesan Vocations Office February 7-9 at the Tracy Center.

In closing, the beginning of a new calendar year is an excellent time to recommit ourselves to supporting our Church through Stewardship of Finance. It is often said that we reveal our priorities through the content of our daily planners and checkbooks. In essence, we indicate what is important by the ways we invest our time and money. Please join me in revisiting our individual practices of giving to our Sunday collection, Building Fund, and other special appeals to insure that they are reflective of our income and gratitude to God for His many blessings.

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him." James and his brother John dropped everything to follow Christ. In leaving their boat, they also left their livelihood. In leaving their father, they said farewell to the comforts of home and family. They embarked on this unknown journey with Jesus, traveling "around all of Galilee," with neither stability nor security. All they had was trust. How remarkable this is! They had such great faith in this man who "called them" on the seashore. Clearly, their encounter with Christ was life-changing, even before they knew the full truth of who Jesus was.

We, on the other hand, already know. We have the benefit of being on the other side of Christ's life. We know about his miracles, his resurrection, and the whole history of Christian faith. In a sense, it should be easier for us to "leave our nets" than it was for the sets of brothers in today's Gospel. We have so many reasons to believe that Jesus was truly the Son of God. But yet how often do we resist the call to surrender our lives to Christ? How attached we are to our regular routines and our predictable plans. Yet, where would we be today if the apostles had tried to parttime it with the Lord? What if they had only followed him on the weekends? Would the Christian message have spread at all? So much was accomplished through the sincere faith of these humble fishermen. What could we accomplish if we trusted in Jesus as they did?
