Dear Parishioners,

Please pray for our 11th Graders who will be on their Confirmation Retreat this Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday at Rosaryville Retreat House. I will spend Monday evening and all day Tuesday with them in order to participate in at least a portion of their retreat. A retreat is a special time of communion with God and the deepening of one's faith through the mediation of the retreat director and the positive example of one's peers.

A good number of the men of our parish just attended a retreat at Manresa Retreat House earlier this month. Many of them have made it a practice or tradition to return to Manresa on the same weekend each year in order to give needed time and attention to their spiritual lives. For others this was their first experience of a silent, preached retreat in the Jesuit tradition. Everyone that I spoke to said that it was an excellent retreat this year.

The Cenacle Retreat House in Metairie was recently purchased by the Archdiocese of New Orleans and it now operates as a ministry of the Archdiocese. It has a long history of offering retreats especially for women similar to those offered by Manresa for men. Some of the upcoming retreat directors listed in their newsletter include Father Donald Blanchard, Father Simeon Gallagher, OFM Cap., Sister Catherine Cahill, OSF, and Sister Judith Gomila, MSC. I know many of the women of our parish attend a retreat there at least once a year.

On Wednesday evening of this week we have a meeting of the fair committee to review plans for this year's "Feast on the Levee." The meeting is at 6:00 p.m. in the Activity Center and anyone is welcome to attend. It's not too early to begin collecting items for the silent auction or to consider how you would like to contribute to the success of this year's fair. Please continue your generous support of this important event.

Each of us has a role to play in the success of large parish undertakings such as our annual *Feast on the Levee*. Some people are good at planning and organizing, others excel at recruiting volunteers or soliciting

donations, and still others contribute by cooking and serving. All of us can help by purchasing small or large raffle tickets, and selling some to our friends. This Friday evening and Saturday morning, August 1 and 2, is the monthly all-night Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament led by our Catholic Daughters and Knights of Columbus. The twelve hour period begins at 8:00 p.m. Friday evening and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning. A schedule is available in the back of church if you would like to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration in the presence of our Lord.

My schedule has been busy with weddings and other activities this summer, but I plan on taking about ten days of vacation beginning on August 4. I will say a little more about my plans in next week's bulletin. Have a good week!

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." How many of us think of our faith as "a pearl of great price"? How many of us really recognize the precious treasure we already possess? As baptized Christians, we have been welcomed into God's family. We are royalty in his kingdom! No matter what our status may be on earth, no matter what treasures we may or may not own right now, we are heirs of God's heavenly kingdom. It is easy to take this for granted, however. On this side of eternity, it's even a temptation to forget that we have been adopted into God's family. Right now, for us, "the kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field." That is to say, the treasure isn't always so obvious. But that doesn't mean it isn't there. It just means that we have to dig a little bit to find it. We have to remove whatever layers of dirt or sand may be obscuring the priceless package and bring it back into the daylight.

So where is our treasure buried? What, if anything, is obscuring the full flourishing of our faith? Is it buried by the demands of work or school? Is our faith hidden beneath the weight of sickness or sorrow? Have we covered it over with false "treasures" that only give us fleeting joy? Or have we never even given our faith the chance to come into the sunlight at all?

Whatever it is for each one of us, we should resolve to recover the treasure that lies beneath our feet. By giving ourselves to Christ, encountering him regularly through prayer, Scripture study, and the sacraments, we too can experience the joy of that blessed merchant who, by selling all he had, truly became rich.
