Dear Parishioners,

We bid farewell to seminarian Patrick Landaiche this weekend as he completes his summer internship in our parish. Patrick can now enjoy a couple of weeks of rest and relaxation before he reports back to the seminary on August 18 to begin his final year of philosophy and pre-theology studies. God willing he will be ordained to the priesthood in May of 2018.

Patrick was a joy to have around the rectory and parish this summer. He is even-tempered and balanced in his approach to faith and ministry, which is something of a rarity in today's polarized society. He also possesses a good sense of humor which is essential for handling stress and progressing in humility. I know he will be a success in whatever vocation he chooses, and I pray that his discernment may continue to direct him toward the priesthood.

Mr. Ryan Verret, the Director of the Louisiana Right to Life's Center for Medical Ethics, will give a presentation in our parish this Thursday, August 1, at 7:00 p.m. in the Activity Center. His presentation will focus on human dignity and end-of-life issues, and how we can better protect the ill, disabled, and elderly from discrimination, abuse, direct killing, and denial of life-saving treatment. Ryan is a native of Breaux Bridge where he still lives with his wife and two children. I thank Julie Millard for taking the initiative to bring Mr. Verret to our parish.

Our Catholic faith calls us to grow in our appreciation for the dignity of all human life so that we can safeguard and celebrate this wonderful gift from God. Seeing the world through the eyes of faith allows us to care deeply about the unborn, the poor, the disabled, and the elderly. We conduct clothing drives, organize prayer chains, lobby elected officials, support homeless shelters, and do everything possible to alleviate human suffering. In doing so we give witness to the heavenly kingdom which has yet to be realized in our earthly societies.

I mentioned last week that our Confirmation candidates are scheduled to attend a three day retreat next weekend, August 2-4, at Rosaryville Retreat House near Ponchatoula. The retreat offers a chance for our 11th graders to get away just prior to the start of their junior year of high school and come together as a

class to deepen their relationship with Christ and the Church. Father Tony Russo will say the 4:30, 9:00, and 11:00 Masses, and Father Jerry Burns will say the 7:30 Mass here next weekend so I can attend the retreat with our 11th graders. Their Confirmation Mass is scheduled for April 24, 2014.

We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick two weeks from now on Saturday, August 10, immediately following the 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass. Any person who is seriously ill because of sickness, old age, or injury may be anointed. The illness may be either physical or mental. Anointing is also allowed prior to undergoing surgery. Please spread the word to your family and friends who may be in need of the healing graces provided through this special sacrament. And please pray for your fellow parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound, or struggling with cancer or some other serious illness.
