Dear Parishioners,

The changes in priests' parish assignments in our diocese became effective July 1. There were two changes to the personnel of parishes located within our Northwest Deanery. Father Reuben Dykes, the parochial vicar at Holy Family Parish in Port Allen, has been reassigned to serve as the parochial vicar in the three parishes of St. James in St. James, St. Philip in Vacherie, and Our Lady of Peace in South Vacherie. Father David Allen will continue to serve as pastor of Holy Family Parish but without the assistance of a parochial vicar

Secondly, Father Chris Decker was appointed as the new pastor of the three parishes of St. Joseph in Grosse Tete, Immaculate Heart of Mary in Maringouin, and St. Frances Cabrini in Livonia. Father Amrit Raj, IMS, will stay on as parochial vicar for the three parishes. It is not an easy assignment to serve as pastor for three communities but Father Decker has the youth, energy, and pastoral spirit necessary to succeed in this endeavor. He is a native of St. Isidore Parish in Baker and was ordained in 2007.

On a related note, the Society of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart, more commonly known as The Josephites, is a religious congregation of priests and brothers dedicated to serving the African American community. In our diocese they currently staff the parishes of St. Augustine in New Roads and St. Francis Xavier in Baton Rouge. They recently decided to transfer their novitiate from Washington, DC to St. Augustine Parish in New Roads in the building formerly used as the convent. Father Joseph Doyle, SSJ, will serve as director for three men entering the novitiate for the Josephites.

A novitiate is a period of preparation and formation prior to the taking of vows in a religious community. The period must last at least one year during which time the novices are instructed in the meaning of the vows they are about to take, the particular history and charism of their religious order, and further practice in prayer, discernment, and the spiritual life. After completing their novitiate in New Roads, the novices will be able to request first vows before relocating to Washington, DC to begin their theological studies.

The Confirmation Retreat for our 11<sup>th</sup> graders is at the end of this month on Thursday-Saturday, July 28-30, at Rosaryville Retreat Center near Ponchatoula. A two night retreat provides a wonderful experience for our candidates to grow closer to God in preparation for their final sacrament of initiation. The date for Confirmation is Thursday, January 26, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. so please keep them in your prayers during the next six months. I look forward to spending some time with them at their retreat.

Finally, we had another great turnout for our Ministry Appreciation Supper last Saturday. We continued our tradition of recognizing one parishioner for his or her example of service, and this year we honored *Jack Sarradet* for his faithful and dedicated service to our parish. Jack is a daily communicant and serves the Church in numerous ways but especially as a volunteer with the Food Pantry, Zippers, and *Feast on the Levee*. He served our country as a Marine in WWII and continues to serve our community as a member of the honor guard at veterans' funerals. May God continue to bless him and all the many wonderful volunteers in our parish.

## 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Can we be counted among the laborers? Are we ready and willing to work for the sake of our faith, or are we looking for the easy way out?

Our faith is more than a personal experience. It's more than a routine that fits into our weekly schedule. Our faith is meant to be shared with others, even when that requires a bit of work on our part. In today's Gospel, Jesus calls his followers to "Go on your way," to prepare people for the Lord. And we are called to do the same. We are meant to go on our way-out of our homes, and even out of our churches-to share the good news of the Gospel and to serve those in need.

It can be tempting to think, "I believe, I go to church, isn't that enough?" But Jesus tells us that there is an abundant harvest out there-countless people who may just need to know that Jesus loves them or that someone is willing to help. If we don't step up to the task then those people will miss out on that word of encouragement, that personal invitation to Mass, that act of kindness that might have made all the difference in their life. God may be calling some of us to an even deeper commitment-to be a lay minister in a parish or to discern a religious vocation, for example -but there is no doubt that God is calling all of us to labor for his kingdom in some way.

This mission isn't for someone else. It's for us to carry out the work of the disciples because we are today's disciples. When we accept this mission, we will not only enjoy seeing the benefits that others receive, we will also rejoice with those whose "names are written in heaven."
