Dear Parishioners,

We recently had some work done to repair and strengthen all of the pews in the two center sections of the church. Spacers were added to prevent the kneelers from sliding off their brackets, and the center braces which support the middle of each pew were also stabilized. We will eventually do the same to the smaller sections of pews along the walls of the church.

The finances of the church are doing very well and I plan to issue a detailed report after the fiscal year ends on June 30. As I mentioned a few weeks ago, we recently had the interior of the activity center painted, and we try to give a little attention to different areas of our campus throughout the year. I hope to address the landscaping and the brick planters in the front of church next.

With the ordination of Father Matt Graham last month, we now have five Father Matt's serving in the Diocese. For many years I was the only active priest with that most honorable name but I am now joined by Father Matt Dupré, Father Matt McCaughey, Father Matt Bonk, C.Ss.R., and Father Matt Graham. Father Bonk is a Redemptorist priest on temporary assignment in the Diocese while the rest of us are Diocesan priests. I hope to stay in Brusly another seven years or so, and then lobby for Father McCaughey or Father Graham to take my place so you don't have to waste time and energy learning a new name for your pastor.

Even with the three new priests added to our roster this summer, we still face a declining number of priests to serve an increasing number of Catholics. Just over a year ago Bishop Muench established a *Pastoral Planning Task Force* chaired by Father Trey Nelson to develop strategies for meeting the pastoral needs of the Diocese. The Task Force has surveyed all of the priests and is now in the process of visiting each of our church parishes to survey and consult the laity. A facilitator is scheduled to visit our parish on Tuesday, June 30, at 6:30 p.m. to meet with a cross section of parishioners involved in various ministries. The Task Force hopes to complete its study by the end of the year in order to present its findings and recommendations to Bishop Muench.

Remember to mark your calendars for our annual Ministry Appreciation Dinner to be held two weeks from now on Saturday, June 27, beginning at 5:30 p.m. in the parish activity center. The dinner is our way of thanking all of you who contribute to the vitality of our parish through serving in one of our various ministries. Please RSVP to the parish office so we will know how much food to prepare.

We will have a training session for new altar servers this weekend, on Sunday, June 14, at 2:00 p.m. Boys and girls entering the 5th grade and above are eligible to become altar servers so please speak to your child about serving. A refresher course for current altar servers will be offered in two weeks on Sunday, June 28, at 2:00 p.m. for those wishing to review the procedures for serving at Mass.

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"It is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how." In today's parable about the kingdom of God, Jesus gives us the image of something that grows "of its own accord." Yes, the man does the initial planting of the seed, but the real miracle of the seed turning into a full-grown plant happens without the intervention of the farmer. God makes it happen.

So too, with the kingdom of God, we are called to participate to a certain extent, but also to allow God to work. We first do our part when we "scatter seed" of faith, by living out the baptism that made us children of this glorious kingdom. But even as we make our daily choices to follow Christ and live as his children--with all the actions, decision, and commitments that entails--we still get to enjoy the miracle of sitting back and watching God's providence in action.

Just think of the beauty of creation and the seasons. Think about the gift of a newborn baby in the arms of its parents. Think about the surprising situations that resolved themselves in our relationships, jobs, and families. Think of the encouraging stories of forgiveness, reconciliation, and conversion that we have heard or experienced firsthand. Think of the blessings that have somehow come out of the trials and tribulations of our lives. Think of all the sick, poor, and lonely who have been comforted by believers. Think of the moments of peace and insight that we have received in prayer. So it is that God makes our seeds "sprout and grow" when we sincerely take that first step of faith to enter his kingdom.
