Dear Parishioners,

As I mentioned last week, we will take a second collection on the weekend of July 2-3 to benefit St. Joseph Abbey and Seminary College near Covington. The Abbey suffered major damage as a result of flooding on March 11. Our collection will take place just prior to the Feast of St. Benedict on July 11. This Friday, June 24, is the solemnity of the *Nativity of St. John the Baptist*, our patronal feast day. A patron saint is something like a heavenly godfather or godmother, or an advocate who intercedes for his or her godchildren. Professions have patron saints, as do countries, individuals, and of course parishes. We are blessed to live and practice our faith under the patronage of so great a saint, who was praised by Jesus himself who once said "among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist..." (Matt. 11:11)

Our annual Ministry Appreciation Dinner is next Saturday, June 25, beginning at 5:30 p.m. in the parish activity center. The dinner is our way of thanking all of you who contribute to the vitality of our parish through serving in one of our various ministries. Please RSVP to the parish office so we will know how much food to prepare.

Dr. Paul Kalanithi was an Indian American neurosurgeon and writer. He was diagnosed with stage IV lung cancer in 2013 just as he was completing his medical residency. Like Father Than Vu, a priest of our Diocese who also died from the disease, Paul had never been a smoker. He died just two years later at the age of 37, but not before writing a memoir on his life and illness entitled "When Breath Becomes Air," published posthumously in January 2016.

Remarkably, Paul and his wife Lucy decided to start a family even after receiving this heart-breaking diagnosis. In weighing the decision, Lucy asked her husband "Will having a newborn distract from the time we have together? Don't you think saying goodbye to your child will make your death more painful?" Paul

answered, "Wouldn't it be great if it did?" He later added, "Lucy and I both felt that life wasn't about avoiding suffering."

Paul ends one of his essays with the following message to his daughter: "When you come to one of the many moments in life when you must give an account of yourself...do not, I pray, discount that you filled a dying man's days with a sated joy, a joy unknown to me in all my prior years, a joy that does not hunger for more and more, but rests, satisfied. In this time, right now, that is an enormous thing."

Those are very beautiful words written by a man who was only able to experience fatherhood for a brief eight months. And yet he captured the sacred and life-changing love which is placed in a parent's heart. Happy Father's Day to all of the fathers in our parish!

### 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Once when Jesus was praying in solitude, and the disciples were with him..." The first line of today's Gospel presents a strange image. Jesus was both by himself and with others. He was somehow experiencing the solitude of personal prayer, but was also close enough to his followers to engage in conversation with them. Although we don't know exactly what the details were of this situation, it does suggest for us an example of what we might call spiritual "balance." Here we see Jesus taking time to be alone in prayer, but also taking time to engage in spiritual reflection with the other members of his community. He didn't sacrifice one for the other. He found a way to have both.

We are called to do the same. Developing the habit of personal prayer is an essential part of our spiritual lives. Like Jesus, we too need to set aside time and space to pray by ourselves, connecting as individuals with our Father in heaven. Whether it be a few quiet moments in the morning, or time to pray at night, this kind of prayer keeps us connected to God. It enables us to give our own answer the poignant question Jesus poses today, "But who do you say that I am?" Personal prayer alone, however, is not enough to fulfill us spiritually. We are also meant to participate in the larger community of believers, joining together with others in communal prayer and reflection.

This, of course, happens every time we attend Mass as we gather together at church and join in the liturgy. For some, "sacrificing" our Sunday mornings week after week may seem like too much to ask. But this is one way we can carry out the challenging command of Christ to take up our cross and follow him.
