Dear Parishioners,

Tuesday, June 24, is the solemnity of the *Nativity of St. John the Baptist*, our patronal feast day. As far as I know, there are only three feasts in celebration of a person's birth on the Church's liturgical calendar: those of Mary, Jesus, and our own John the Baptist. St. Luke tells us that Elizabeth was six months into her pregnancy when the annunciation to Mary took place, so John's feast day is celebrated six months before Christmas.

Strictly speaking, in liturgical language a "nativity" is not a birthday. Birthdays are anniversaries of births while a nativity is the birth itself. So at our Mass on Tuesday we will celebrate John the Baptist's birth rather than his birthday. St. John the Baptist is the patron saint of monks, French Canada, Jordan, Puerto Rico and its capital city San Juan. It is interesting to note that John the Baptist is also mentioned by name in the Quran and is revered by Muslims as a prophet.

A patron saint is something like a heavenly godfather or godmother, or an advocate who intercedes for his or her godchildren. Professions have patron saints, as do countries, individuals, and of course parishes. We are blessed to live and practice our faith under the patronage of so great a saint, who was praised by Jesus himself who once said "among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist..." (Matt. 11:11)

Friday, June 27, is the solemnity of the *Most Sacred Heart of Jesus*. This feast is celebrated each year on the third Friday after Pentecost. Devotions on this Friday originally focused on the wounds of Christ. Catholics of the Middle Ages drew strength through meditating on the suffering of Christ. Over time the focus shifted to the love of Christ as symbolized by his sacred heart. Catholics struggling with the reality of sin needed reminding that God's love was stronger than sin.

Next Sunday would ordinarily be the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time but this year it is the solemnity of *Saints Peter and Paul* since their June 29 feast day falls on Sunday. According to tradition, St. Peter was martyred in Rome around the year 64, and St. Paul was martyerd

in Rome around the year 67. Their respective tombs are located under the altars of the two Roman basilicas dedicated to them.

The cost is \$25.00 per child, with discounts for families with three of more children, and the deadline to register in June 30. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." With these words, Jesus distinguished himself from other spiritual leaders. He was doing more than offering advice. He was offering himself: "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Through the Eucharist, Jesus provided a way for his followers to be intimately connected with him, not just with his ideas. When we receive this sacrament, we are able to be close to the Lord not only in our hearts, but in our bodies as well. In other words, we are able to unite our entire beingbody and soul--to Christ.

Unlike other prophets, Jesus did not just describe a "path" to follow. He told people that he was "the way" (Jn 14:6). He made very bold claims about reaching spiritual fulfillment, and one of them involved receiving him in the Eucharist: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." We thus have a choice to make. Will we eat this living bread? Will we really allow Jesus to become part of us? If we answer yes then we partake of true Communion--we enter into a profound union with the Lord. But if we choose not to eat this bread from heaven (or if we eat it without faith or reverence) then we miss out on Christ's invitation to unity with him. Instead we would be like those in the crowd who "quarreled among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" They thought Jesus couldn't have been serious about this. But he was. He insisted, "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." Today on the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may God grant us the faith to recognize the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
