Dear Parishioners,

In my homily last Sunday I mentioned the following description of prayer that I find very helpful: *To pray is to be in God's presence with open hands and an open heart. If we stay that way long enough, God will come and have a look in our open hands. "So many things," God will say. "Would you mind if I took something out?" "Of course not, God, that's why I'm here with my hands open." Another time, God will wander through our prayer and ask, "Would you mind if I put something in those open hands?" The season of Lent is a special time of year when our hearts are unusually receptive to God's grace and guiding presence. He helps us to let go of hurts, resentments, and unhealthy attachments in order to live with a greater sense of freedom. 



It has been suggested that some articles should be published from time to time addressing the history of our church and its contents. The following is the first with more to come. ENJOY!!!

ST. RITA OF CASCIA

In August of 2016, a long lost "friend" of St. John the Baptist returned to Brusly. This friend was an unassuming statue of St. Rita of Cascia which had sat for decades next to the reredos of the main altar before being removed and sold at auction in the early 1970's. St. Rita may have been one of the number of artworks purchased by Fr. Eugene Royer during his pastorate from 1901-1936. The exact date of her purchase is unknown but we know she was in the Sanctuary by 1948 from the wedding photos of Paul Caffarel and Joyce Peavy.

Ruth Landry purchased the statue at auction, and it remained with her until the late 1990's. Eventually, the statue was taken to Arizona to reside with Jackie Rita Murphy, Ruth's niece, and later found its way to Jackie's mother, Rita May LaBauve Mullins. Rita offered to return the statue to Ruth during an August 2016 visit to Arizona. Ruth and her brother, Fr. Joel LaBauve, secured St. Rita in the back seat of their car for the return trip.

Following St. Rita's return to Brusly, Patrice Brewer engaged her friend, Bob Dubos, to restore the statue. The restoration process revealed that St. Rita had once been previously repaired with sheet metal in her head and refinished with automotive paint. St. Rita presently resides in the Bridal Room of the Annex.

St. Rita was a 24th century Augustinian nun, who was canonized on May 24, 1900 . Our statue depicts her in a black habit, a Rosary at her waist, gazing at a crucifix, with a forehead wound indicative of the partial stigmata which she bore. She is a patron Saint of widows, impossible causes, bodily ills, and sterility. It would not be unreasonable to assume that many a petition was addressed for St. Rita's intercession while she graced our church.
