Dear Parishioners,

Young adult missionaries from the Baton Rouge Diocese are scheduled to visit our parish next weekend, May 23-24, to speak to us about their upcoming trip to Honduras. This is the same group that visited our parish in March 2012 and they are here to once again ask for our prayers and material support for this year's mission. The local contact for the ministry is Mr. Steven Brooksher who is very active in the Diocese and at his home parish of St. Aloysius in Baton Rouge.

Catholics have a long and rich tradition of supporting missionary efforts around the world. We enjoy opportunities to see faith in action as volunteers and religious help to improve the quality of life for people living in impoverished countries or areas. Not everyone is called to serve in the foreign missions but all of us are called to at least have a missionary spirit. Missionaries from our Diocese who serve for even a few weeks are able to come back to Louisiana and raise awareness of our brothers and sisters in other lands.

We are also inspired by the example of our fellow Catholics who serve the poor and needy here at home. Some visit the prisons to bring communion or teach adult religious education. Others serve at the soup kitchens and homeless shelters, and still others offer to bring the elderly to the doctor or grocery store. Some are good at listening and praying with the sick and others are good at organizing food drives and emergency assistance. All of us are called to pray for one another and help lift the spirits of the down trodden.

This Thursday is the last day of school in West Baton Rouge Parish so I congratulate all of our students and teachers on the completion of another successful year. Beginnings and endings are sacred moments which help us to pause and give thanks for the past and future. We do our best to forget the painful or unpleasant moments and hold on to the beautiful and grace-filled moments. The Ascension of the Lord

"So then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven ... But they went forth and preached everywhere." What a roller coaster of emotions the disciples must have experienced. First, they had come to know Jesus and had changed their lives to follow him. Then they had watched him die a tragic death on the cross. Following that, they were astonished to experience the glory of his resurrection, and then they enjoyed his company for a while longer. But now, they had to bid farewell again. Now they watched as Jesus ascended into heaven, leaving them with their instructions: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature."

It's inspiring to see how the disciples handled all of this. Even though they must have been struggling with a kind of sadness or disappointment when Jesus left them, they didn't dwell on that. They went out and did what they had been called to do. They "preached everywhere" and shared with others the good news. Focusing on the joy they had come to know through their relationship with Jesus, they were able to share that joy with the people around them.

Like the first disciples, we are also called to share the gospel with others. Certainly through our lived example we should reveal to others the joy that Jesus brings. Even though he is not physically walking amongst us, the lives of Christian believers reveal an ongoing relationship with him. There may be times and situations, however, that require more of us than just being witnesses. Sometimes God calls us to share more directly and more courageously the message of faith. May we follow the example of the disciples, who readily embraced this call.
