Dear Parishioners,

We rejoice that our local Church now has another young priest to celebrate Mass and the sacraments for the people of our Diocese. Father Joseph Hoang Vu, a parishioner of Sts. Anthony and Le Van Phung Parish, was ordained this weekend by Bishop Robert Muench. Father Joseph Vu, no relation to our vicar general, Father Than Vu, has been assigned to Christ the King Parish and Catholic Student Center on the campus of L.S.U. effective July 1.

Father Vu is 25 years old and inherits the mantle of youngest diocesan priest from Father Brent Maher who is 28 years old. The oldest priest is Msgr. William Greene, who is 87 years old and retired, but still celebrates daily Mass for the Sisters of St. Joseph at their Hundred Oaks convent.

The Baton Rouge Diocese currently has 53 active and 19 retired Diocesan priests. In addition, there are 29 religious order priests and 4 diocesan priests from other dioceses stationed in our Diocese. All of us together are responsible for providing pastoral care to 67 church parishes and numerous hospitals, schools, retreat houses, and prisons located throughout the Diocese.

As I mentioned two weeks ago, we are blessed to have a seminarian, Patrick Landaiche, live and work in our parish this summer. He moves in this week to begin an eight-week summer assignment during which time he will join us for prayer, service, spiritual formation, and hopefully a little recreation. Part of Patrick's job description is also to be a witness for vocations so that we can increase our prayers and activities in the hope that our parish will be the source of future vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated religious life.

The only priestly vocation from Brusly still serving as a priest is Father Joel LaBauve, who was ordained on January 31, 1970 at St. Joseph Cathedral, and celebrated his first Mass here at St. John the Baptist. (He recently told me that he remembered the weather being terrible on the day of his first Mass.) Our parish also produced Father Andrew Comeaux, who was ordained here at St. John the Baptist on May 24, 1974

and who served for many years in the Diocese before resigning from the priesthood. Andy is now married and serves as a counselor, hospital chaplain, and Episcopal minister in Shreveport, Louisiana.

So it is past time for a new crop of religious vocations to emerge from St. John the Baptist Parish. Ultimately, all vocations come from God, but I thank Julie Cilano and our catechists and parent volunteers on all of their work with the youth of our parish. There have been numerous advertisements in our bulletin for upcoming summer activities for the youth, and I know this will produce happy and committed young Catholics for our community. Please continue to support them with your prayers and encouragement.

Julie is also planning a few changes to the Christian Formation Program starting this fall. We have an information meeting scheduled this Tuesday, May 28, at 6:30 p.m. in the Activity Center to explain all of the changes. All parents are invited to attend. Thanks for your participation in our parish and have a safe and happy Memorial Day weekend!

The Most Holy Trinity

In the run-up to this Memorial Day weekend you've probably seen veterans out and about holding donation canisters and sporting little paper reproductions of poppies. It was Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae's famous World War I memorial poem, "In Flanders Fields," which inspired the remembrance poppy that is seen at this time of year. While McCrae popularized the red poppy that grew in the cemeteries of France, another man used a different plant to help people remember. Patrick, Apostle to Ireland, used a shamrock, a three-petal leaf to offer a visual explanation of the Holy Trinity, a theological concept that can be difficult to comprehend. Since the leaf is really one, even though it has three lobes, it was a perfect example of the triune God-Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three persons in one God.

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus illuminates the mystery of the Trinity by telling his disciples that the Holy Spirit will guide them to the truth. Jesus indicates that the Holy Spirit shares what is his and he shares what is the Father's. Through centuries of reflection and theological discussion, the church slowly came to perceive the mystery of the Trinity as three persons in one God. While the Father is not the Son, and the Son is not the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit is not the Father, all are God.

Patrick's shamrock was his attempt to help people gain an insight into what is essentially a mystery beyond our understanding. What we do believe is that this God who is three persons is also pure and undivided love. On this weekend when we honor those who gave the full measure of their devotion by wearing red poppies, we also celebrate the One whose love and devotion to his people is undivided and unending. That One is God, the eternal loving Father, the Son who gave his life for us, and the Spirit that is poured into our hearts.
