Dear Parishioners,

Our Catholic Daughters have their jambalaya dinner fundraiser this Sunday, May 4, in support of their many charitable activities. We also chose this Sunday to honor all of our high school seniors at the 11:00 Mass and at lunch immediately following Mass in the parish activity center. Parents and siblings of seniors were also invited to join us for Mass and lunch. The menu is of course jambalaya thanks to the aforementioned CDA fundraiser. Graduation is a great accomplishment and milestone in the life of any person and we are very proud of our graduating seniors.

Nominations are now open to fill two upcoming vacancies on our Parish Pastoral Council. Jerry Deshotel and David Toups are completing their second terms of service on the council and so must be replaced. Nomination forms are available in the back of church and you are invited to nominate yourself or any other registered parishioner. The deadline for nominations is the last Sunday of this month, May 25, and the forms may either be mailed to the church office or placed in the collection basket.

Once all of the nominations have been received, the names will be sent to the members of the current council for prayerful review. The current members will then elect one new member at their June 11 meeting. The second new member will be appointed by me as pastor, and may come from the pool of nominated candidates or from the community at large. Both of the new members will serve three year terms beginning with the September 2014 meeting. This is the main consultative body for our parish so please give serious consideration to possible members.

Next Sunday, May 11, is the date selected to honor our Blessed Mother through a traditional May crowning ceremony. We will follow the same procedure as in past years and process out to our Lourdes Grotto at the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. Mass. The crown will be carried by one of our second graders, accompanied by other children and adults carrying flowers for the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will then offer prayers and hymns to our Blessed Mother as an expression of our love and devotion. This date was chosen to coincide with Mother's Day since Mary is the Mother of Jesus

and the Mother of the Church. In honoring her we honor all of the mothers of our community on this special day.

I will be away from the parish from Monday through Thursday of this week, May 5-8, attending the Spring Formation Days with all of the priests of the Baton Rouge Diocese. Our theme this year is "Pastoring in the 21st Century," and our presenter is Mr. Paul Breaux, founder and managing director of SBS Partners, a management consulting firm. Mr. Breaux had all of the priests complete an online questionnaire prior to the study days to help identify our individual leadership style, so it should be an interesting conference.

Since the Study Days are mandatory for all priests, we will not be able to have daily Mass on Tuesday – Thursday of this week. The priests who I sometimes call to celebrate Mass in my absence will also be attending the study days, so we will have Communion Services in place of the Masses on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of this week. Bishop Muench has also asked that funerals be scheduled after the study days are over if possible, or that one of our deacons celebrate the funeral without a Mass.

3rd Sunday of Easter

"Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him." Can you imagine this scene? Jesus comes up next to these two disciples, walks with them, talks with them, even goes so far as to explain the Scriptures about him to them, and they still fail to notice who he is. Understandably, they were sad, "looking downcast" because of Christ's death. Maybe their eyes glumly watched their feet as they trod along instead of taking in the sights around them. But at some point they must have looked at their companion's face. Why didn't they recognize Jesus until "he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them"?

In everything else during their encounter, Jesus had appeared to be just another man. But when he broke the bread, in fact celebrating the Eucharist, they realized who he was. And then, he "vanished from their sight." Could it be that the risen Lord wanted to teach his followers about the new way in which he was present? He may have vanished from sight, but he did not leave them. He was there, as we Catholics profess, through his real presence in the Eucharist.

We are not so different from the disciples on the road to Emmaus. We may at times become downcast, wishing that Jesus was with us in a more obvious, traditional way. But in fact, the risen Lord comes to join us every time we go to Mass, remaining with us through his presence in the Eucharist. We only need the eyes of faith to believe that it's true. This is not the same as physical sight, to be sure. But he is there. As Jesus himself said in last Sunday's Gospel, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29).
