Dear Parishioners,

On this First Sunday of Advent we might take encouragement from the following reflection posted on Creighton University's Online Ministries:

Many of us are in an ideal place to begin Advent, but we don't know it. It can be tempting to think that, because we are struggling these days, we can't enter into Advent without a big change in our mood or without distancing ourselves from our real experience. Nothing could be further from the truth. Advent is about letting God come to us. We do the letting and God does the coming. And, the whole mystery of our faith is that God is not reluctant to come into an unusual relationship (like Mary and Joseph's) or to be born in the poverty of a makeshift stable. We are tempted to prepare for Advent by cleaning everything up first — by, in effect, saving ourselves first. Our opening to Advent is to realize we need saving and to accept the saving love of our God.

I find that reflection comforting because things can easily become hectic this time of year. Some of our stress might be self-imposed as we try to find the perfect gifts for all of our loved ones. We can easily overspend and overcommit, and by doing so miss out on the spiritual graces that Advent has to offer. Salvation is God's work and God's gift, and we begin this new season by renewing our hope in God's saving love. Try not to worry about the messiness of your current situation or the long list of things you need to accomplish. Focus instead on the soft candle-light of the Advent wreath either at home or in church, and allow the Spirit to guide your devotion.

With trust in God's love, I encourage everyone to go to confession before Christmas so that we can celebrate our savior's birth with joyful hearts and minds. Jesus is the Prince of Peace and we need his gift of peace in order to handle the stress of everyday living. St. John Church in Plaquemine has its penance service this Thursday, December 3, at 6:30 p.m., and Holy Family Church in Port Allen has its penance service one week later on Thursday, December 10, at 6:30 p.m. We will have our penance service here at St. John the Baptist in two weeks on Tuesday, December 15, at 7:00 p.m. We also have our regular

Saturday afternoon confessions from 3:30 – 4:15 p.m. every week.

This Friday evening and Saturday morning, December 4 & 5, is the monthly all-night Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament led by our Catholic Daughters and Knights of Columbus. The twelve hour period begins at 8:00 p.m. Friday evening and ends with 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning. A schedule is available in the back of church if you would like to sign-up for an hour of prayer and adoration in the presence of our Lord.

Tuesday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and a holy day of obligation. Our Masses on the feast day will be at 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The students in our Tuesday night religion classes will attend the 6:00 p.m. Mass that evening instead of class. We honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as patroness of the United States of America under the title of the Immaculate Conception.



## 1st Sunday of Advent

"But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." Jesus instructs his disciples to take this posture of confidence in the midst of a terribly disturbing situation. Describing his second coming, Jesus says that on seeing this event unfold, "People will die of fright." And yet the disciples are supposed to be pillars of strength. While others cower in fear, the Lord's followers are somehow immune, with heads raised high. Why?

Well, presumably, because those who follow Christ-those who earn the distinction of being disciples--have nothing to fear. On the contrary, when they have to "stand before the Son of Man," it will be a happy occasion. But here's the catch: "disciple" is more than an empty title. If we want to be counted among this confident crew, there are a few things for us to do. Today's Gospel spells out these tasks, which are all perfect things to pursue during Advent.

First, we have to make sure that our "hearts do not become drowsy." We are called to stay awake in a spiritual sense, not allowing "carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life" to numb us. We need to avoid whatever might reduce our ability to recognize and relate to Jesus, because we don't want his appearance to catch us "by surprise like a trap." Advent is an ideal time to examine our lives to determine what activities, priorities, or pastimes might be putting our hearts to sleep. Secondly, we need to pray. We need to ask Jesus himself for "the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." We can't do it alone. But with Christ's help, we can be true, fearless disciples.
