### Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The HBO series *Game of Thrones* is a critical and ratings success. It has now completed two seasons and a third is on its way in the spring. The genre show has gained wide appeal, something that doesn't always happen in the convoluted world of fantasy genre. Since the beginning, fan sites have sprung up alongside the official HBO website to help new viewers keep track of the characters. The HBO site even includes a family tree so that viewers can remember who is connected to whom. The basic plot of the show involves the struggle to hold on to power in a kingdom that is threatened by internal strife and natural disaster. Various heirs and other nobles form and reform alliances in an attempt to stay alive. The court intrigue is shown in all its bloody detail.

The Gospel on this feast of Christ the King gives an entirely different picture of kingship. We only have a small snippet from John's Passion narrative, but it is enough to remind of the entire story that we hear on Good Friday. In John's Gospel, Jesus is completely in charge. He is no victim of the crowds. He willingly lays down his life and he takes it up again. Unlike the characters in *Game of Thrones*, the members of Christ's family are not scheming for power behind the back of the ruler, because his kingdom is not of this world. He reigns beyond the power of any foe to depose him.

Being an attendant of Christ (to use the word from the Gospel) is to listen to the voice of the King. As our prayers tell us today, he rules over "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace." So many television viewers are enamored of *Game of Thrones*. Hopefully our example will invite others to be a part of the kingdom of Christ.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the last Sunday of our liturgical year—the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is a fairly new feast added to the Church calendar in 1925 on the Sunday before All Saints by Pope Pius XI, and moved to its present location on the last Sunday of the church year in 1969. Christ the King is also the name of the parish and student center on the L.S.U. campus which serves all of the Catholic students and faculty.

Christ's kingship is a spiritual and eternal kingship, and as such is not concerned with earthly power and privilege. However, this does not mean that the church should appear detached and uninterested in human affairs. In service to Christ our King, the church bears witness to the truth by proclaiming and protecting the dignity of every man, woman, and child. This means that we work within whatever political system we find ourselves to serve the highest good.

The Catholic Church does not and cannot align itself with any particular political party or candidate. The Church's role is to educate her members regarding the teachings of our faith, to help provide analysis of important issues, and to participate in the debate over public policy. To do less would turn religion into a purely private matter without any practical effect on our communal life and the well-being of our society.

As I mentioned in last Sunday's bulletin, the special appeal for St. Joseph Abbey and Seminary College takes place this weekend, November 24—25, at all of our Masses. I thank Father Vic Messina for celebrating the Masses and making the appeal on behalf of the monks and seminarians. The Diocese of Baton Rouge has 14 seminarians in formation this year and eight of them attend St. Joseph Seminary College. Please take time to view the new vocation poster on the bulletin board in church and also in the activity center with the names and pictures of our seminarians.

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year. We will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance for this year's R.C.I.A.

inquiry class at the 9:00 a.m. Mass next Sunday. You may remember from past years that this rite includes the tracing of the cross over the foreheads, shoulders, eyes, ears, and hands of the candidates. The candidates attend the first half of the Mass before being dismissed to continue their reflection and discussion of the Sunday readings. Please keep them in your prayers as they discern whether God is calling them to the Catholic faith.

Finally, I wish to thank all of the members of the committee who worked on our new pictorial directory. I think the final product turned out beautiful and was delivered to us in a timely fashion compared with my past experience with pictorial directories. The hard work involved with scheduling the family portraits and designing the layout paid off. Well done!
