Dear Parishioners,

Please join me in offering prayers for one of our former pastors, Msgr. Gerald Lefebvre, who died on September 18 and was buried a week ago on September 23. Msgr. Lefebvre was a native of Port Allen and served as pastor of St. John the Baptist Parish from 1973-1975.

Msgr. Lefebvre was ordained on June 9, 1956 for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. His ordination class included Msgr. Earl Gauthreaux, Msgr. Leo Guillot, Father Hubert Brou, Father John McDonald, and Father Robert Marcell. He became a priest of the Diocese of Baton Rouge when it was established in 1961.

I served as his associate pastor from 1986-1988 at St. Patrick Parish in Baton Rouge immediately following my ordination. Msgr. Lefebvre, or Gerald as I called him, was the pastor, I was the associate, Father James Clement was a retired priest in residence, and Father Patrick Hunter, S.J., was a Jesuit priest who also lived with us while working on his PhD at LSU. It was a very interesting living situation with the four of us crowded into a rather small house.

Gerald did not place very many restrictions on my ministry and so allowed me a great deal of freedom to develop my priestly gifts. He had worked for many years in the marriage tribunal and had a special ministry to divorced and separated Catholics. He possessed a most compassionate heart for those who had experienced loss and were learning to start over again.

The early days of cable television included channels from Chicago and Atlanta and so we followed the Chicago Cubs and Atlanta Braves baseball games. Gerald also enjoyed politics and was a life-long and unapologetic Democrat. CNN was the favored channel before the days of FOX News, and we enjoyed following political campaigns and election returns. After he retired, he continued to celebrate Mass at several parishes and nursing homes, and will be greatly missed by friends, family, and parishioners. May he rest in peace.

This coming week of October 3-6 is the week during which all of the priests of the Diocese of Baton Rouge

make their annual priests' retreat. Most of the priests will be at Manresa Retreat House but I am taking the opportunity to join two other priests in a private retreat in Mobile, Alabama. So please pray for us as we promise to do the same for all of you. We will have Communion Services on Tuesday – Thursday of this week while I am on retreat. Funerals will most likely be led by one of our deacons since the Bishop has asked that we not interrupt our retreat if at all possible.

Our annual *Cards, Etc. Party* is one week from Monday on October 10, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Activity Center. The cost is \$25 which includes a spaghetti and meatballs lunch. The *Feast on the Levee* is about four weeks away and scheduled for Sunday, October 30, 2016. Thanks to everyone for offering your support and returning your raffle ticket stubs and money.

27th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do." What a humble attitude this would be! Jesus challenges us today not to boast, not to seek special praise, not to consider ourselves worthy of some great reward when we follow him. Rather, he honestly reminds us that it is simply our duty to do all we "have been commanded."

God made us. Our lives are a result of his loving initiative. Giving ourselves back to him through "the obedience of faith" (as the Second Vatican Council called it), is truly the only appropriate response. Of course we are free NOT to practice this obedience. We are free to reject God, to ignore his commandments, even to make ourselves his enemies. But nonetheless it remains true that what we ought to do is to love God and follow his ways. And Jesus suggests today that this simple obedience should be a given in our lives. Following the commandments is merely what we are obligated to do.

But, let's not forget that we are also free to do more. Because of the nature of love, we can never really exhaust it. We can always love more, serve more devotedly, give more generously. Perhaps Jesus is calling us to focus less on meeting the bare-bones requirements of Christianity, and instead to shift our efforts farther in the direction of going above and beyond the call of duty. Instead of asking what is the least I HAVE to do, we would do well to ask, what ELSE can I do? What else can I do to show my gratitude to God for all he has given me? What else can I do to serve his people and nurture the world he has made? Let us aim to become truly profitable servants.
