Dear Parishioners,

I am in Dallas, Texas this weekend attending the LSU - Miami football game, and so I thank Father Armando Reyes for celebrating our Masses while making an appeal on behalf of his Diocese of Gumaca in the Philippines. I will return on Tuesday evening and be back in the office on Wednesday. We will have a Communion Service in place of the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Tuesday, September 4.

I wrote earlier this summer that Father Ryan Hallford was transferred from Holy Family Parish to St. Jude Parish in Baton Rouge, and that Father Matt Dupré was assigned to live at Holy Family Parish while offering weekend assistance at various parishes in the Diocese. I also asked you to pray for Msgr. Robert Berggreen who was experiencing some health issues.

Unfortunately, Msgr. Berggreen's health issues required his resignation as pastor of St. Mary's in New Roads in order to better focus on his recovery. He subsequently underwent back surgery and is now receiving physical therapy in order that he might return to ministry. Father Pat Broussard has been appointed administrator of St. Mary's and is moving into the parish this weekend to serve as their parish priest. Please pray for Msgr. Berggreen, Father Pat, and the parishioners of St. Mary's during this time of transition

On a personal note, my mother has been experiencing memory loss and difficulty in sleeping at night, and was recently diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's disease. My father, sister, brother, and I made the difficult decision to place her in a small assisted-living home so that she could receive the appropriate care and my father could better rest at night. She has adjusted very well thanks in large part to her strong Catholic faith.

I know that many of you have had to face similar decisions in caring for a spouse or parent. Some of us have the ability to care for a loved one at home and others require the move to an outside facility. When one suffers all suffer since we are so deeply connected to one another by love. Please pray for the sick, their families and caregivers, and especially those who are alone with no one to care for them.

### 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Judgment tends to have a bad reputation. We often associate it with condemnation, and in the Gospels, we associate it with the Pharisees. Today's Gospel features the Pharisees doing exactly what we expect. "They observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands." The Jewish people had strict purification laws that applied to all areas of life. The Pharisees attempt to accuse Jesus of not following the ancestral traditions. Jesus doesn't take offense at their judgments per se. He instead points out the hypocrisy of their words. "You hypocrites? this people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."

From there, Jesus turns his attention to the concerns of the heart. "The things that come from within are what defile." He lists off a number of sins, including some the Pharisees were likely struggling with, including evil thoughts, envy, and arrogance. When we examine the list, perhaps we're reminded of our own trips to the confessional! As we strive to follow Jesus and live with integrity, we must be aware of our hearts. We must judge our own actions. Are they leading us closer to God or away from Him? Are we growing in love of our neighbor, or are we becoming more closed in on ourselves?

As we move into this week, consider the state of our own heart. Perhaps you are overly scrupulous in less important areas. Perhaps there are large areas of overlooked sin that you've excused for too long. Whatever it is, the judgment of God need not cripple us. He offers us a share in His mercy as soon as we turn to Him. This week, allow your heart to be transformed!
