Dear Parishioners.

The Office of Vocations publishes a monthly online newsletter to keep everyone informed of various retreats and activities related to vocations and seminarians. If you would like to read it simply go to our diocesan website (http://diobr.org/) and click on the "Office of Vocations" business card icon located near the bottom of the home page, and finally click on "Newsletters." A link to the monthly newsletter is also posted on the "Baton Rouge Vocations" *Facebook* page.

In the August edition of the Vocations Newsletter, Father Matt Dupré announced that eight new men are entering the seminary this fall which brings our total number of seminarians to nineteen. That is fantastic news for our Church and our Diocese so please continue your prayers for Father Matt and for the good work he is doing in the area of vocations. While the number of seminarians is not nearly as important as the quality of the seminarians, I am still praying that we exceed twenty seminarians next year.

Two of the new seminarians are from Our Lady of Mercy Parish, one is from St. Anthony Parish in Baton Rouge, another is from St. Isidore Parish in Baker, one is from St. Margaret Parish in Albany, one is from St. Joseph Parish in Paulina, and the last two are from St. Mary Parish in New Roads. It is heartening to see that they represent all regions of our Diocese and range in age from 18-29.

Father Matt has been doing a great job directing vocations but needs extra prayers since he was asked on August 1 to temporarily serve as administrator of St. Theresa Parish in Gonzales. The pastor of St. Theresa, Father Gary Belsome, requested a leave of absence from active ministry and the Bishop felt that the best person to take his place was Father Matt Dupré. We know Father Matt will enjoy taking care of a parish again even if it does mean wearing two hats since he still has his vocation director assignment. Please keep him in your prayers.

Fewer priests may eventually require us to return to a style of ministry more similar to that practiced by the early missionaries in our state. Priests were responsiible for larger geographical areas and focused on celebrating the sacraments and strengthening the faith rather than on other administrative and pastoral tasks. When I was ordained there were seventeen priests serving our Northwest Deanery (comprising the civil parishes of Iberville, West Baton Rouge, and Pointe Coupee). We now have just ten priests serving the same area and I am sure other areas of the Diocese reflect similar changes.

This changing landscape invites us to embrace a more flexible attitude regarding parish boundaries and sacramental celebrations. For example, we did not have a vigil Mass for the Feast of the Assumption but we did have an evening Mass on the feast day. Holy Family and St. John the Evangelist both had vigil Masses but did not have evening Masses. We all advertised each other's schedule and Catholics traveled to whichever Mass they could attend even if it was in a neighboring parish. It was a small but beautiful example of cooperation.
