Dear Parishioners,

On Wednesday of this week I will be mailing a letter to each of our registered families asking that we prayerfully consider increasing our offertory contribution by a small amount. No priest enjoys asking for money but every so often it is necessary in order to keep up with the rising costs of essential services such as insurance, utilities, salaries, and the maintenance of our church and parish buildings.

Our offertory collections for the fiscal year just ended on June 30, 2014 totaled \$549,333. This was about \$6,000 less than the previous year. Our Building Fund collections totaled \$181,914, or \$71,336 less than the previous year. The decrease in Building Fund collections was expected since the majority of pledges are now paid in full. Thanks to the generous bequest of Mr. Leighton Delahaye, our debt now stands at \$715,265, which is still a big number but significantly less than the previous balance of \$1.1 million.

Our expenses for the previous fiscal year included \$273,401 for clergy and lay salaries, \$127,107 for support of diocesan services, \$45,270 for utilities, and \$37,431 for insurance. These amounts reflect about a 4.7% increase over last year's expenses which is in part the reason why I now ask for your help.

The generosity of one or two families cannot supply the income needed to put us in positive territory but all of us working together can surely bridge the gap. I completely understand those of you who are on fixed incomes or who have recently increased your giving. But others among us may not have examined their contributions in some time and might be able to increase their giving by \$5, \$10, or even \$15 per week. I really need your help so please pray about it and then return the response card included with my letter.

This year's *Feast on the Levee* is Sunday, October 26, and I hope you will all be able to join us for food, music, and fellowship. Even though I had to dip into our savings last year to pay bills, I try to hold the *Feast* income as sacred and reserved for special projects rather than typical operating expenses. Last year's *Feast* income was divided between our Building Fund Savings (\$20,000), Loan Repayment (\$20,000), and

regular Parish Savings (\$19,000).

The *Feast on the Levee* serves as both a fund raiser and a community builder for our church parish. Your donations of time, food, and money help to strengthen the ties that bind us together as a community of faith. Please support this important annual event by your presence at the *Feast*, and by your sale or purchase of raffle tickets and other donations which contribute to its success.

The August Pot Luck supper was a great success and it's already time for our September supper. The Parish Pot Luck this month will take place on Thursday, September 18, beginning at 6:30 p.m. in the Activity Center. The theme this month is *Barbeque* so please make plans to join us!



The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

"And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up." The first reading today refers to the story of the Israelites and the serpents. These venomous creatures were biting and killing the people of Israel wandering in the desert. Moses begged God to save them from the affliction. God chose a strange antidote to the poison: he told Moses to mount a bronze serpent on a pole. Those who looked at it survived.

In the Gospel reading, John refers to this historical event in the context of salvation. Then, the people of God were saved from physical death by looking up. Now, we are saved from spiritual death in much the same way. Through the cross where Jesus was "lifted up," God has given us an antidote to the poison of sin. The habits of selfishness that threaten to suffocate our souls can be overcome when we raise our eyes to this cross upon which Christ made the ultimate act of self-lessness.

Today at Mass, many of us will sing the rousing hymn "Lift High the Cross" and call to mind this "triumphant sign" that has come to be equivalent with Christianity itself. The cross is our symbol, our banner, and our hope. As Christians, we march behind it with confidence and courage because through it, even the most fearsome of all human realities-sin and death-have been conquered. Now we can enjoy the gift of eternal life.

But, like the children of Israel wandering in the desert, we have to participate in our own salvation. God desired that they actively "look" at the bronze seraph instead of passively being cured. So too, we must choose to actively embrace the cross of Christ by modeling our lives after the generous, life-giving love of the Lord.
